

## **Degrees...what's the difference?**

<u>Associate's Degree</u> – A degree you earn after attending a community college for about 2 years

**Bachelor's Degree** – A degree you earn after attending a university for about 4 years

**Professional Degree** – A degree you earn after you graduate from a 4 year university and THEN you continue your education in graduate school (2 yrs + )

## What is an Impacted Campus ?

- When the number of applications received by a CSU campus from qualified applicants is greater than the number of available spaces.
- In this case, an impacted campus is allowed to use additional criteria to screen applications.
- Campuses without the impaction designation at the program or campus level are open to all CSU eligible applicants using the
  - CSU Eligibility Index GPA x800+ SAT test scores

minimum eligibility index of 2950



- Eligibility in the Local Context (ELC)
   CA residents only
- 6. Quality of senior-year program of study
- Academic opportunities in California high schools
- Outstanding performance in one or more academic subject areas
- 9. Achievements in special projects
- 10. Improvement in academic performance
- Special talents, achievements and awards
- Participation in educational preparation programs
- Academic accomplishment in light of life experiences
- 14. Geographic location

- Applicants will choose 4 out of 8 questions to answer
- Each response is limited to <u>350</u> words
- All questions have equal value in the admissions selection process.

Goal:

- Provide context for your experience and academic performance.
- Expand on all other information provided on the UC application.

### Important Tips to Successfully Complete Your College Applications

- 1. Always use your <u>full legal name</u> and double check your social security number to make sure it is correct (if applicable
- 2. Use a professional education email address that you check often .
- 3. Provide correct family income and household size.
- 4. Always provide <u>accurate information about yourself</u>.
- 5. Your self-reported grades and courses <u>must match</u> your transcript.
- 6. Fill out applications for Fall 2020 Freshman application.
- 7. Make sure to list the <u>correct high school(s) and community college(if applicable) and for the correct</u> <u>years of attendance</u>.
- 8. Use the <u>Additional Comments</u> section to your advantage.
- 9. Self-report your <u>highest test scores</u>, but <u>send all your scores to all your schools</u>.
- 10. Submit your applications <u>early</u> --*before Thanksgiving Break!!*
- 11. STEM majors are <u>competitive</u>.
- 12. Research <u>scholarships</u> provided by the colleges and universities.
- 13. Make sure you submit your FAFSA or Ca Dream Act Application ASAP.
- 14. Find the help you need!! Reach out to your counselor or advisor when you need help.

- Include:
  - time spent or years of participation
  - a description of your role
  - a description of your activities and

what you learned/gained.
