A person seeking to enroll a child should use this form as evidence of residency when he or she cannot produce Category I documentation such as a lease, or other similar document due to living with a district resident. Proof of residency documents from Category II will be required to establish your residency in the District. Proof of property ownership or lease is required for the resident with whom the student is residing. The School District reserves the right to evaluate the evidence presented; completing this form does not guarantee admission.

WARNING: If a student is determined to be a nonresident of the District for whom tuition must be charged, the persons enrolling the student are liable for non-resident tuition from the date the student began attending a District school as a non-resident.

A person who knowingly enrolls or attempts to enroll in this School District on a tuition-free basis a student known by that person to be a nonresident of the district is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor, except in very limited situations as defined in State law (105 ILCS 5/10-20.12b(e)). A person who knowingly or willfully presents to the School District any false information regarding the residency of a student for the purpose of enabling that student to attend any school in that district without the payment of a nonresident tuition charge is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor (105 ILCS 5/10-20.12b(f)).
