### **PREP CONNECT**

Fairfield Prep has an online portal called <u>Prep Connect</u>, where we house all important school-related information. All students and parents should currently have login information for Prep Connect. The portal is accessible by visiting our website <u>www.fairfieldprep.org</u>, clicking the navigation symbol at the top right of the page and clicking PREP CONNECT in the menu. Beneath that you will also see a Quicklinks, with shortcuts to specific pages. <u>Prep Connect</u> gives parents and students direct access to the following platforms:

- **NEW THIS YEAR:** Absence Form (parents must submit for partial or full-day student absence)
- Schoology (course assignments)
- NetClassroom (progress reporting and grades)
- Naviance (college info/applications)
- PAC card (dollars to be used for lunch purchases, vending machines and printing)
- Smart Tuition (payment of tuition and other activities)
- FACTS (financial aid)
- Parents & Students (programs, activities, forms and documents, Bellarmine Guild and Fathers' Club)

Prep Connect also includes the Student Directory and School Calendar (with iCal feed) on the top of the portal page. #### **FORMS & DOCUMENTS**

A number of important forms and documents can be found in the <u>Parents & Students section</u> under Forms & Documents, or by visiting <u>www.fairfieldprep.org/forms</u>. Here are a few of the key sections:

- **HEALTH FORMS** State Health Assessment Record, Sports Physical Form, and Medication Order forms can all be printed, taken to your doctor, and then mailed to Fairfield Prep. A valid sports physical must be on file to participate on any team.
- **ATHLETIC FORMS & DOCUMENTS** Participation in Prep athletics requires the reading of the documents by students and parents, plus submission of the Online Registration form for each sport.
- **ACADEMIC FORMS & DOCUMENTS** Please review this year's <u>Student/Parent Handbook</u> for the rules and regulations currently in effect.
- **TRANSPORTATION & FEES** This section includes the forms for the shuttle bus and other special student activities. Read important details about Metro North, town buses, parking and carpools.

#### SCHOOL CALENDAR

### **Orientations**

Tuesday, August 27 Freshman Orientation 8:30 a.m. – 2:15 p.m.

Wednesday, August 28 Sophomore/Junior Orientation 8:30 a.m. – 11 a.m.

Wednesday, August 28 Senior Orientation 11:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. (lunch will be provided)

- On orientation days, students report directly to the Student Life Center. Student homeroom information will be posted on the main bulletin board in Berchmans Hall.
- For their orientation day, students may wear a collared polo shirt, casual pants/shorts (no jeans), and athletic footwear.
- Parents of freshmen are asked to drop students off near the grand staircase entrance of Arrupe Hall in the faculty parking lot, where they will be met by our upperclassmen leaders.

First Day of Classes — Thursday, August 29......All Classes Begin

<u>College Information Evening</u> — Thursday, Sept. 12 from 5:30-6:30 p.m. in the Student Life Center. This event is being held by the Guidance Department and it is open to the parents of seniors.

<u>Back-to-School Night</u> — Thursday, Sept. 12 from 7-9 p.m. During this evening, parents will be able to meet their son's teachers by attending an abbreviated version of his class schedule.

#### IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE STUDENT HANDBOOK FOR 2019-2020

The changes reflect what we felt were some necessary and timely changes to the school dress code and the alcohol and drug policy. The modifications to the dress code represent a community-wide effort to offer better clarity as to what may be worn. Additionally, the revision to the alcohol and drug policy represents a shift from the three strikes policy. This change is rooted firmly in our desire to keep our students safe and our school day and events free of illegal substances. The following are the changes we would like to highlight:

# **Changes to the Dress Code**

- Only Fairfield Prep apparel may be worn as a mid-layer during the school day. Prep vests, crew-neck sweatshirts, and quarter-zips are permitted. Hoodies and parkas **may not** be worn in the school building.
- Prep Pride sells outerwear that may not be acceptable to wear in school on a daily basis. Please check
  with the Dean of Students before making any purchases to determine if the apparel may be
  worn during the school day.
- A proper uniform shirt must be worn under the outerwear at all times, as flannel shirts will no longer be permitted.
- Boots will no longer be permitted during the school day.
- A blazer will be required during school-wide Masses.

# New 2019-2020 Locker Policy

Lockers will be assigned to all freshmen and sophomores. If any junior or senior needs one, he must request it, and one will be assigned to him from the Dean of Student's Office.

### **Alcohol and Drug Policy**

A student will be subject to dismissal following a second incident in which he is found in possession of alcohol or illegal drugs at school or a school-related event. Please review the 2019-2020 Student Parent Handbook, and these policies in particular, with your son so as to avoid any misunderstandings on the procedures that are followed when a breach of the policy occurs.

#### **TRANSPORTATION**

- Town buses are provided for students residing in Fairfield who live more than 1.5 miles from campus. The routes will be posted on the main bulletin board in Berchmans Hall at the end of August. **To opt out of the bus service** please fill out the Bus Opt-Out Form at <a href="https://www.fairfieldprep.org/busopt">www.fairfieldprep.org/busopt</a>.
- Shuttle buses from the Fairfield train station to Fairfield Prep will leave beginning at 7:30 a.m. The shuttle bus will begin on Thursday, August 29. To help defray the cost of the shuttle, a yearly fee will be charged. In order to receive a sticker, which will enable students to ride the shuttle, you must enroll and pay online. Stickers can be picked up in the Operations Office (Xavier 101). Shuttle bus transportation will not be provided without a sticker after the first two weeks of school (grace period).

- Metro North commuters: Fairfield Prep submits its roster of students directly to Metro North. Please complete and submit Prep's Metro-North Student Registration form. All new students must be entered by Prep into the Metro North's Mail&Ride system no later than August 10 to receive the September ticket. Student discounted train tickets MUST be purchased online through the Metro North web site.
- <u>"Carpool to School"</u> allows Prep families to arrange their own carpools for school day and after-school sports and activities. The link to the website is in Quicklinks and at <u>www.fairfieldprep.org/carpool</u>.
- There are two fee-based buses that run to and from Fairfield Prep. The first bus runs through Bethany,
  Woodbridge, Derby, the Easton Monroe border and Trumbull. The second bus runs through Ridgefield

#### ON-CAMPUS PARKING PERMITS

Permits for campus parking will be limited to designated areas on campus. **All juniors and seniors who wish to obtain a permit must follow this procedure in order to register:** Report to the Security Office in Loyola with a license, Prep ID, car registration, and a check made payable to Fairfield University for \$150. Parking permits are available beginning Aug. 5, Monday-Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Unregistered cars will be ticketed beginning Wed., Sept. 11.

#### ATHLETIC TRYOUTS

In order to participate in tryouts for any Prep sport, it is mandatory that the following information be submitted:

- Current valid physical to the school nurse, Mary Ellen Lehmann, at mlehmann@fairfieldprep.org.
- Online registration for the specified sport: <u>www.jesuitpride.com</u> > Registration.

- **Football**: August 19-23, 3-6 p.m. <u>Barlow Field</u>. All freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors. Freshmen should arrive on Aug. 19 at 2 p.m. for helmet distribution.
- Soccer: August 29 & Aug. 30: 3-5 p.m. at Rafferty Stadium for freshmen, 5-7 p.m. for JV/Varsity.
- Cross Country: August 23: 3-5 p.m., Lessing Field Track, all freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors.
- Crew: August 29 & Aug. 30: 3-5 p.m., <u>Alumni Hall</u> Erg Room, all freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors.
- Sailing: September 3: 3-5 p.m., Pequot Yacht Club, all freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors.
