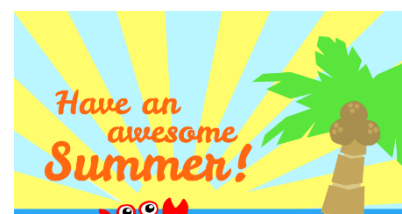

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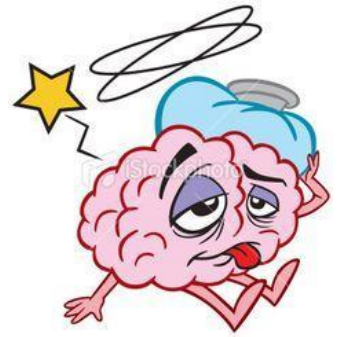
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Is it really just a bump on the head?

A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury that is caused by a bump or blow to the head. Even if the injury appears insignificant it is important to continue to monitor for continuing or reoccurring signs and symptoms.

Symptoms to report to your health care provider:

- Headache or “pressure” in the head
- Nausea or vomiting
- Balance problems or dizziness: more clumsily
- “Not feeling right” or “Feeling down”: mood, behavior or personality changes.
- Double or blurry vision
- Feeling sluggish, foggy, groggy, or hazy: answers questions slowly
- Noise Sensitivity
- Concentration or memory problems: forgets instruction or confused about simple things.
- Light sensitivity



All of these symptoms if continuing after the initial injury are an indication that your child should be seen by a doctor. There are also more severe symptoms in which your child should be seen urgently in the ER such as, unequal pupils, drowsiness that they do not easily awake from, slurred speech, convulsion, seizures, repeated vomiting or nausea, a headache that gets worse and does not go away, etc. Please see the CDC web site for a full list.

If your child has had a concussion they may need more rest. This rest includes time away from screens, fewer hours at school, reduced time reading, writing or computer work to allow their brain to recovery. Research has shown that students who have a concussion recover more slowly if they do not get the proper rest for their brains. A doctor can help provide guidance for both parents and the school regarding the best plan for your child’s recovery from a concussion.



Attention parents of 5th Grade students:

As your student is starting to transition into 6th grade, we also need to take a look at immunizations. Tdap is an immunization that is required by the state of Wisconsin for all students entering 6th grade. Please schedule an appointment for your child now so that this will be completed before the beginning of the school year. If you are not wanting your child immunized a signed waiver will be required. Please do keep in mind that vaccines help prevent illness and the spread of disease.

There are 3 other vaccines that your pediatrician will also talk with you about when you go for your appointment. The Human papillomavirus vaccine (HPV) can help prevent certain kinds of cancer. The second vaccine is the Meningococcal conjugate vaccine that helps prevent meningitis which is caused by a bacteria that can cross from the blood into the brain and spinal cord resulting in a severe illness. The third vaccine recommended is the flu shot.

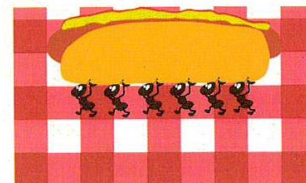

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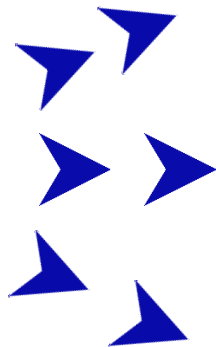
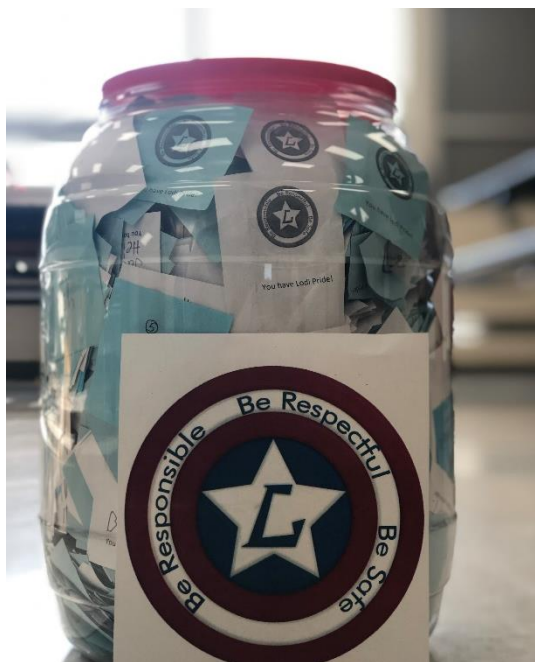
