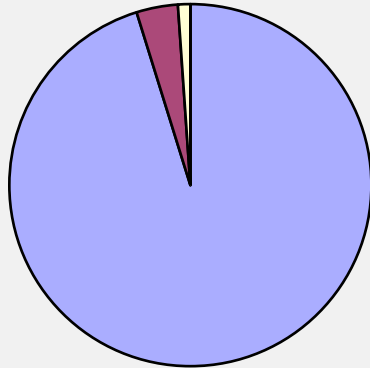


Jack sends mean texts to his classmate John. Mary sits next to John and sees Jack's mean texts. What should Mary do?



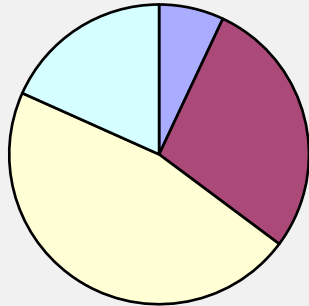

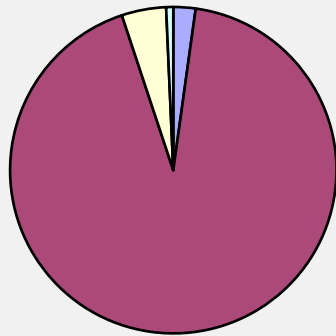


Different students are described below. From these facts, which student seems to be a good digital citizen?
