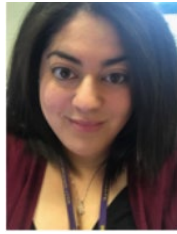


# Welcome to First Grade!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to first grade and to the beginning of what promises to be a wonderful year! We look forward to meeting you and working with your child. First grade is such an exciting year for all of us. This letter is intended to help you and your child feel more comfortable about the beginning of school. Please read the list below and hold onto it for future reference.

1. It is very important to keep the lines of communication open between home and school. Should you have any questions, concerns, or information that may affect your child in school, please send in a note or call and leave a message for me at the school office or on my voicemail (610-645-1430). We will discuss email communication at Open House. Throughout the year, you can also find information about our classroom on our Blackboard.
2. Please read and respond promptly to notes you receive from school. Your child will be bringing home a binder/folder every night with homework and important papers. Please check this folder nightly and help your child develop a routine for completing assignments.

Additionally, on Thursdays, you will receive a "Thursday Envelope" email with materials from Dr. Martino, the HSA, the School District, etc.

3. Please return your child's "Dismissal Form" (included in this mailing) at the first grade orientation or on the first day of school. Please explain how your child will come to school and how s/he will be going home (bus number, dropped off/picked up by whom, before/after care, etc). Any changes in your child's regular dismissal routine **MUST** be written in a note. Without a note, I must send your child home the normal way.
4. If your child is absent from school, you must send in a short note on the day s/he returns explaining the absence.
5. Please label all clothing, school bags, lunch boxes or bags, supplies, etc. Children get upset when they lose something or confuse their belongings with another child's.
6. Please encourage your child to leave all toys at home. Too often they get lost or broken, and more importantly, they are distracting to the children.
7. We will have a twenty-minute snack every day. Your child is encouraged to bring in a healthy snack (fruit, cheese, pretzels, crackers etc.) that is easy to eat. Also, if you pack your child's lunch, please be sure your child knows what should be eaten for snack and what should be eaten for lunch. It is also important to remember to pack this additional snack, even when your child is buying lunch in the cafeteria.
8. Lunches cost \$3.00. Milk, juice, ice cream and other snacks may also be purchased separately. An account can be set up for your child so that s/he does not have to bring money to school each day. This is definitely the easiest way for your child to buy lunch. You will receive more information about setting up an account on the first day of school.

\*For the first week of school, it might be helpful to pack your child's lunch so s/he can become acclimated to the lunchroom procedures without the stress of buying a lunch.

9. You and your new first grader are invited to come meet me and take a look around our classroom at our first grade orientation this summer. Please feel free to bring any of the enclosed forms if you happen to fill them out before then.

We hope this letter answers some of your questions. Please feel free to contact us at any time if we can help make the transition from kindergarten to first grade easier for you and your child. We look forward to a fantastic year!

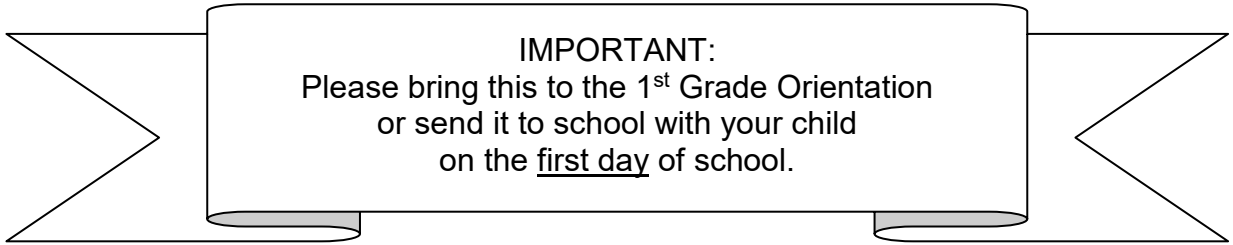
## Email Connection

# Supply List for First Grade

Although the school provides many supplies for your child, there are some additional items that I would like to request your child bring to school. It would be helpful to have them by the first day of school, I will certainly understand if you haven't collected everything by the first day of school.

The following supplies will be communal:

- 2 packs of pencils with erasers (sharpened, if possible)
- 2 packs of big glue sticks
- 1 bag of Ziploc gallon bags
- 1 bag of Ziploc sandwich bags
- 1 box of crayons (Crayola 64 count)
- 2 packs of colored pencils without erasers (Crayola 24 pack)  3 boxes of markers (Crayola Assorted Color Markers -12 pack)  1 pack of 3X5 index cards (multi colored pack with lines)
- 1 package of post-it notes
- 2 containers of Clorox Antibacterial wipes
- 1 bottle of anti-bacterial gel
- 2 boxes of tissues
- 1 roll of paper towels

The following supplies will be your child's:

- 2 durable pocket folders (3-hole punched to go inside the binder)
- 1 half inch binder (3 ring loose leaf binder) with inside pockets, and a clear plastic display pocket on the front for paper to be inserted  1 pocket folder for French Class
- 1 pair of headphones (to use with iPads & at our "listening center")  1 composition notebook
