DRESS AND GROOMING

The Governing Board believes that since classified employees serve as role models and represent the District when working with students, staff, parents, and members of the community, they should maintain professional standards of dress and grooming.

It's the Board's expectation that during school hours, employees wear clothing that demonstrates their high regard for education and presents an image consistent with their job responsibilities and the applicable provisions of the current employee Master Agreement.
