EARLY MIDDLE SCHOOL EXECUTIVE SKILLS & EXPECTATIONS

The teaching teams in Early Middle School will place a heavy emphasis on the development of crucial skills to help students successfully transition into Middle School and beyond.

General Organization	 Students will work on their organization skills with their locker, backpack, and binder. Weekly planner sheets are used by each student to organize their assignments/ assessments. Extra support is provided as needed. 	 Teachers partner with students to help them stay organized with their work, requirements, materials, supplies, etc. Extra support is made available for students as needed.
Time Management	 Students are taught how to manage time and expectations. 5 minutes are given in between classes to gather supplies and take care of personal needs. Homeroom time at the end of the day is used for homework or STEAM activities. Academic Support time is provided when needed. 	 Students are held accountable for being on time and managing the expectations in and out of class. 5 minutes are given between classes, and students learn how to manage that time independently. Homeroom time is given at the end of the day to allow homework to be started or students create a plan for what they need to accomplish that evening. Academic support time is provided each morning for students to use as needed.
Study Skills	 Teachers work on various study skills with the students such as note taking, Quizlet, flash cards, reviews, Moby Max, BrainPOP, Spelling City, etc. Time is spent introducing strategies for studying. 	 Teachers work on various study skills with the students such as note taking, Quizlet, MobyMax, flash cards, reviews, etc. Time is spent in class utilizing strategies for studying and comparing outcomes with different strategies used as students work through their units of study.

Student Leadership Group	 Students apply, and teachers select this group based on set criteria. Changing Classes	• Each student will be assigned a homeroom class and will rotate as a homeroom to each of the 5th grade teachers.	 Students change classes six times a day. (language arts, math, science, history, Bible & electives). Students do not rotate as homerooms but have classes with a variety of students during the day.
Enrichment Classes/ Electives	 5th grade enrichment classes include: PE, Art, Technology, Music, and Library. Each homeroom will attend each enrichment class once a week. 	 Students select the electives they are interested in taking. Electives are 9 or 18 weeks in duration, and they meet daily.

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Homework	 Homework is assigned in fifth grade with purpose. When homework is assigned students record it on their weekly planner. o Reading log is filled out each day to record daily reading. Assigned classroom work needs to be completed at home, if not finished in class 	 Homework is assigned in sixth grade with purpose. o Nightly homework is assigned in Math and Language Arts to assess student growth on specific skills o Other homework is assigned as necessary throughout the year. Studying for tests becomes a more independent homework activity.
Character Development	 Leadership opportunities include: Safety Patrol Student Ambassadors Classroom jobs Prayer volunteers Personal Responsibility: Students are expected to keep up with assignments and materials. Students are held accountable for their actions and behaviors through a weekly marking system with RAM buck rewards. Parent Communication	 Weekly newsletters include announcements and any assignments/assessments for the upcoming week in all classes. Weekly e-mail with announcements and newsletter attached. Friday folders are sent home every week. They contain graded papers and a copy of the weekly newsletter. Social Interactions	 Students work together as partners, small and large groups during class projects. Subject specific teamworking activities are done throughout the year. Teachers help guide conversations as needed when there is a misunderstanding between students. STEAM and collaboration activities take place at least 3 times a week. 	 Students work together as partners, and in both small and large groups during class projects. Students have the opportunity to work with a variety of students because their classes do not travel as a homeroom. Teamworking activities are done throughout the year as a grade level group and in individual subjects. Teachers help guide one-on-one conversations as needed when there is a misunderstanding between students.
Lockers	 All students will be given the opportunity to earn lock-free locker during the school year. Students are encouraged to use lockers to store books/materials between classes. It is their responsibility to collect the materials needed for each class. 	 All students are assigned a locker. They have the option to use the lock or lock-free option. Lockers should hold the materials they are not using in their current class. They will be expected to know what they must bring to each class.
School Supplies	 All work for each class will be organized in one binder. In addition, students will have one plastic folder that will be used for their weekly homework. A Friday folder goes home each week. 	 Work is organized by using a set of color- coded folders, one for each subject. Time is spent on organizing lockers, backpacks, and folders on a regular basis.
