At the time and since, I felt that we, as a community, are truly fortunate to be amongst such talented and hard-working young people.

Words matter and how they are spoken, and the way they are delivered makes all the difference in how they are received. On Wednesday, the energy and the intensity of the speakers drew deserved applause. Every sentence was perfectly balanced as they were uttered, leaving the audience wanting more.

Coincidentally, I had recently finished Andrew Roberts' mammoth biography of Winston Churchill. Throughout that 1000 page tome, Roberts emphasises the power of words in general and the compelling oratory of Churchill in particular as the major influence on binding the nation together at a time of crisis. Called by one contemporary historian a master and slave of the English language, Churchill had devoted his life to the study of public speaking. His use of language changed the future.

In watching the orators, public speakers and performers of the future, I felt on that Wednesday that the art of speaking was well established here at SWPS.
