The public and internal examinations are here and the usual and effective guidelines and hints for revision will be making their way towards every SWPS student.

Such advice is both clear and grounded in common sense. A good night's sleep, exercise and eating well are the basic ingredients to being successful in anything we do and, unsurprisingly, examinations are no different.

Today I want to highlight five slightly more unusual ways in which revision and exam success can be achieved, which I hope may be of use in the coming weeks. So here are my five key pointers for success to our students:

1. DON'T PUT IT OFF.

We all love to procrastinate and put off hard, boring tasks. Yet the later the revision is left, the more time we waste not revising, the less time there is for the information to embed. Starting revision is often the hardest part, but once you are engaged, it gets easier.

2. STUDY ENVIRONMENT MATTERS

Where do you study and revise? A tidy desk is always useful but current research suggests that by changing the places where we study at certain points—moving around—can also be helpful. We can become less concerned about the location of study and focus rather on what we study.

3. VARIETY IS THE KEY

Increasingly researchers are finding that the study of a range of subjects in one sitting actually leads to higher retention than focusing on one area of study. It is certainly more interesting for you and is a better workout for the brain.

4. WORK WITH YOUR FRIENDS

At this time of the year, we all have a common focus and goal – to be successful in our examinations. Working with your friends at certain times is a good way of supporting revision. Teaching them a concept, for example, or being taught by them as part of the revision process, ensures that you both understand what it is you need to know. As any teacher will tell you, it is only once you have to explain a concept to someone else, that you realise how well you have understood it.

5. AND LOOK AFTER YOURSELF

Look after yourself - sleep properly, eat well, and keep exercising. Don't think you have the time to squeeze in self-care during the hectic revision schedule? Think again and see how much time you can claw back by cutting back on hours lost to social media distractions.



Hayun will have a busy timetable of individual violin lessons, rehearsals in ensembles, a choir and a symphony orchestra, and classes in theory, aural, composing and conducting. For her audition Hayun played 'Meditation' from Thais by J. Massenet and Beethoven's Violin Sonata No. 4 in A minor, op. 23.

OPEN EVENING


