What is a tipping point and why is it important to single sex education? It sounds like a trick question or at least one to stump a trembling student at an Oxbridge interview.

Malcolm Gladwell popularised the notion "tipping point" in his book The Tipping Point: How Little Things Can make a Big Difference, in which he discussed the moment when a virus reaches a critical mass and then quickly diffuses into the general population. This idea has both been influential and criticised. Its impact in terms of our understanding of cultural trends suggests that cultural interactions are swayed by the relative proportions of groups within society.

So much for the theory, but what does this mean in the real world and for women in particular? The social scientist Rosabeth Moss Kanter demonstrated that when only few women are included, for example, in corporate board, both the men and the women behaved in similar ways. Namely, the culture of the organisation did not change significantly, if at all. Even if the minorities had different interests or behaviours, the pressure to conform was overwhelming.

But, she found, once a certain threshold in the number of women on the board was reached - about one third and above – the women were empowered and felt themselves to be more empowered, to express themselves more freely and to challenge conventional ways of thinking more willingly and confidently. The culture of the organisation changed and developed.

It was recognised that this process of change is slow – it is, in fact, a slow process of value change. The culture which empowers confidence to challenge existing frameworks and structures takes time to nurture.

And therein lies an advantage of a single sexed school. This culture of empowerment and confidence already exists. It may appear paradoxical perhaps, yet the fact that SWPS is a single sexed school removes at a stroke these barriers and restrictions. In short a critical mass is not necessary for change leading to empowerment, because it already exists. SWPS students can and do reject stereotypical gender roles and bias to embrace those subjects, opportunities and activities which suit them.

The world is changing dramatically and in an age of Brexit and Trump, the themes of isolation and fragmentation permeating the western world stand in sharp contrast to events along the Silk Roads, where ties have been strengthened and mutual cooperation established.

Following the Silk Roads eastwards from Europe through to China, by way of Russia and the Middle East, *"The New Silk Roads"* provides a timely reminder that we live in a world that is profoundly interconnected. In this prescient contemporary history, Frankopan assesses the global reverberations of these continual shifts in the centre of power - all too often absent from headlines in the west.

This important book asks us to reread who we are and where we are in the world, illuminating the themes on which all our lives and livelihoods depend.
