In June 2015, the founder of Facebook, Mark Zuckerberg, took the opportunity of a question and answer session to describe a vision for his company. His plan for the future was startling, extraordinary, and verged on the science fiction. In his words "One I believe that we'll be able to send full rich thoughts to each other using technology...this would be ultimate communication

technology."

Four years later a huge amount of investment has already been directed in this area of technology. The Boston start-up, Neurable, is seeking to develop technologies that can track "intentions" of users in virtual reality environments. In April 2017, Regina Dugan, Facebook's lead on technologies that blend the physical and digital world, said "it may be possible for me to think in Mandarin and you to feel it instantly in Spanish". Excited or terrified by this prospect? Whether this is technically possible is in some ways less important than the ethical and social questions such advances throw up. From privacy to ownership, we all think and feel things that we would rather not be shared. We know that how we are perceived, or rather how we think that we are seen by others, rightly or not, does have an impact on self-esteem, anxiety and overall happiness, and in no section of society more than teenagers.

What do we already know? According to a review of 19 studies from 12 industrialised countries, adolescent girls are now experiencing more depression and anxiety attributed to "high expectation on girls in terms of appearance and weight". How is this "expectation" being transmitted? Through social media, where the concept of likes are prevalent. Indeed, the study further shows that girls are suffering twice the amount of anxiety compared to boys. Whilst there are, undoubtedly, many factors that contributed to this rise, there is increasing evidence to suggest that a possible link between anxiety among teenagers and what they see in terms of perfection. The idea of perfection comes from external pressures – again in how one thinks others see them.

So where does this leave schools? Such technology, or something like it, may well be with us in the not too distant future. But the questions of self-esteem, anxiety and happiness are with us now. Education must take the lead in ensuring that our young people understand the potential dangers as well as the exciting opportunities that new technology will bring. But we must also confirm that to feel valued, loved and appreciated is something that is experienced in the physical world. No matter how much our young people think that the world of social media is real, it is a "second world" and a lesser one at that. The real world is the one we enjoy together and it is the one that matters. It is the world where we do, in reality, connect with each other, positively and beneficially. It is a crucial message.
