### Further Information

- Full course details are set out in the Sixth Form Courses 2019-2021 brochure.
- Reformed A levels are fully linear courses. All external examinations are taken at the end of the Upper Sixth and assess the full two years of Sixth Form study.
- Cambridge International A level courses are available in some subjects. These courses typically consist of four modules. All external examinations are taken at the end of the Upper Sixth.
- Cambridge Pre-U courses are available in some subjects. All external examinations are taken at the end of the Upper Sixth.
- **Only one subject can be chosen in any one block.** Pupils will typically study 3 A level courses (or the equivalent curriculum loading) in the Lower Sixth and continue with all of these courses into the Upper Sixth. With the school's agreement, and depending upon prior attainment, aspirations, subject choices and co-curricular load, there are options to study more or less courses than this.
- The minimum entry requirement before embarking on a 3 A level programme (or the equivalent) is at least 30 points from the pupil's best 6 GCSE/IGCSE/BTEC courses.
- Where a subject has previously been studied at GCSE, at least a grade 6 (B) is typically advisable if the subject is to be studied at A level (please refer to the published 'Requirements for entry onto specific A level/Pre-U/BTEC courses' for full details).
- GCSE English and/or GCSE Maths must be selected by pupils yet to achieve a grade 4 (C) (or equivalent) in these subjects.
- Multiple A level equivalent BTEC courses are timetabled across three blocks. Single A level equivalent BTEC courses are available in one block only. All BTEC courses are modular, assignment based courses which are largely continuously assessed. The minimum entry requirement for a multiple A level equivalent BTEC course is at least 20 points from the pupil's best 5 GCSE/IGCSE/BTEC courses.
- The WJEC Level 3 Certificate in Food Science & Nutrition is available in one block and is similar in approach and assessment to a single A level equivalent BTEC course.
- Preparation for university examinations in English is available for overseas pupils (IELTS).
- SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) for American Universities is available.
- BHS (British Horse Society Complete Horsemanship Certificate) can be taken by arrangement.
