Transition to PowerSchool (www.penncrest.org/powerschool)

On <u>August 21, 2019</u>, our new student information system, PowerSchool, will be operable. Powerschool is a comprehensive records management system that includes an electronic gradebook, report cards, student registration, emergency notifications, and more. *Each family will need to complete the online registration prior to viewing student schedules and teacher assignments*. Over the next few days, you will receive a letter from your child's school. This letter will have the information needed to set up your account.

Any parent who would like assistance with PowerSchool is invited to his or her child's school on August 22 from 7:00am - 3:00pm and on August 26th from 7:00am - 7:00pm.

We appreciate your cooperation and patience during this transition.

Transportation Updates

We have made several changes to the procedures for student arrival and dismissal.

<u>Transportation guidelines</u> for safe student travel were also updated to increase school bus safety. Bus stop times, locations and assignments will be available the week of August 19. The majority of our bus stops and times have not changed. The transportation office will contact those families that will see a change of stop or time.

This summer we worked with a traffic engineer to review our campus traffic patterns and parking maps to improve safety and increase efficiency. All of our schools have some changes to the 2019-2020 traffic pattern and parking areas. New traffic patterns are clearly delineated with line striping and signage. We are asking for your patience during the first few weeks of school while parents and visitors familiarize themselves with changes.

Beginning this year, we have dedicated time and resources to operating a separate and distinct cyber school. The PENNCREST Cyber Academy (PCA) will operate from the PENNCREST Central Office and is separate from our school campuses. PCA offers an array of electives and opportunities for students, and permits students opportunities to participate in extracurricular and co-curricular activities at their home campus.

School Safety & Security

We consider student safety a top priority. Please know we have ongoing efforts and activities to ensure a safe and secure learning environment. All PENNCREST staff have received ALICE training. ALICE is widely considered the best practice for school threat response. We annually review our Emergency Operations Plan, procedures, and physical facilities with emergency management. District personnel regularly attend safety seminars and workshops to ensure best practices are implemented. Ongoing efforts are in place to enhance our physical security and provide staff with relevant training. Please contact any school administrator if you have any safety concerns.
