



Please be reminded that all drivers are required by state law to **STOP** whenever school buses have their lights flashing and **STOP** arms extended. Failure to do this may result in a fine of up to \$425. For passing a bus with their lights flashing and stop arm extended. This law applies to school yards and parking lots as well as to roadways. Thank you for keeping our students safe.

Telephone Messages 🖀

Please remind your students that the use of cell phones is restricted during the school day. If a parent has an important message for their son/daughter, they should contact the appropriate House Office, preferably before 1:00 p.m. After 1:00 p.m., it may become difficult to deliver the message before the end of the school day.

School Absence

When a student is absent from school, the parent or guardian is requested to call the House Office. If a phone call is not received, the House Secretary will attempt to contact the parent or guardian. Students whose parents or guardians have not confirmed the absence by telephone are expected to present a written excuse to the House Secretary upon returning to school. A student eighteen years or older and not living with a parent or guardian must present a written excuse directly to the House Secretary upon returning to school. Any absence not documented will be considered unexcused. The Housemaster may require written documentation from the student's physician validating the dates of the illnesses.

Partial Days

It is sometimes necessary to have a partial day due to weather events or to accommodate professional learning experiences for <u>teachers</u>. Please be sure to have your child attend classes on these days as our teachers continue moving forward with the curricular material.

Momework Requests M

The House office will honor homework requests for students who are absent from school for two or more consecutive days due to illness. Requests should be made to Mrs. Donna Williams House 2 Administrative Assistant or Mrs. Denise Melanson House 1 Administrative Assistant by 9:00 AM on the second day of absence.



Working papers may be obtained in the <u>Main Office</u> on any school day and throughout the year. The State of Connecticut requires:

- 1) Written promise of a job from the employer describing exactly and specifically the nature of the job; hourly rate of pay, and hours of employment.
- 2) Evidence of age such as a driver's license or birth certificate, official school records can be used (if currently attending NWR#7).
- 3) Student requesting working papers <u>must</u> be present.

Upon change of employment, a new "promise to employ" form must be completed by the new employer and brought to the Main Office. A copy of the original working papers is kept on file in the office. A new copy will be issued.

Immunizations

All students must present proof of immunizations from a physician or local health agency upon enrollment in Region 7. If the student is not immunized due to medical or religious reasons, a notarized statement from a physician and signed by the physician and the parent must be provided. Forms are available on the web site.

7th graders:

The State of CT mandates that ALL 7th graders present proof of immunizations *before the* **START** of the 7th grade year. Region 7 will use the 6th grade physical exam submitted to the elementary school for documentation of mandatory 7th grade immunizations. If you did not submit a 6th grade physical, you will need to present proof of up-to-date immunizations before the end of July. In accordance with CT State law, your child *will be excluded* from 7th grade until this requirement is met.

Physical Examinations

NWR 7 Board policy examination (C.G.S. 10-2045a) mandates that all students must present evidence of a physical:

- 1. Upon enrollment to the district
- 2. 6^{th} grade (submitted to the elementary school)
- 3. 10^{th} grade

CT Health Assessment Record (Blue) Form must be completed in its entirety to include vision, auditory & scoliosis screenings. Camp physicals will <u>not</u> be accepted.

<u>All 10th grade</u> students must submit the physical *before the end* of the 10th grade academic year. In accordance with CT State law, your child *will be excluded* from 11th grade until this requirement is met.

Physician Notes

In keeping with FERPA guidelines for confidentiality & privacy all medical notes must be brought/faxed directly to the Health Office. The nurses will communicate any restrictions to the appropriate staff.

Student Health Emergency Information Forms

This confidential medical information, held on file in the health office, helps us provide for the health and safety of your child. These new "pink" forms must be completed upon entry to NWR7 and <u>updated</u> by the parent/guardian at the <u>beginning</u> of each new school year.

If you indicate that your child has asthma that requires a rescue inhaler or that they have a life-threatening allergy that requires an Epi-Pen, you <u>MUST</u> provide both the medication and a physician-signed Medication Administration form that is also signed by a parent. Without these medications and forms, your child will be excluded from all field trips.

Students with Asthma should have an Asthma Action Plan filled out by doctor. Students with life threatening allergies should have Allergy Action Plan filled out by doctor.

Administration of Medication in School

Nurses must follow CT State law and Board of Education policy re: the administration of medicine to your child. Only FDA medications will be administered during school hours if the desired effect cannot be achieved outside school hours.

- 1. All medications, including emergency self -carry medications, will be administered only with the following:
 - a. Completion of a NWR Medication Administration Form (available on district site), signed by an authorized prescriber and written authorization of the parent.
- 2. Medication orders are valid for one academic year.
- 3. Verbal authorization/request by parents is **not** permitted by law
- 4. All medications must be brought to the health office by an adult with the exception of emergency medications which may be transported by the student:

- a. Epi pens, Inhaler & Insulin supplies
- 5. Students who self -carry these emergency medications must have them <u>on their person</u> at all times in case of an emergency (i.e.: a lock down, fire drill etc.)
- 6. Parents are encouraged to provide a backup medication available in the health office.
- 7. Standing order for Tylenol, Ibuprofen or Tums is available through the district physician. Parents must complete the (purple) permission form in order for their child to receive medication.
- 8. All medication will be dispensed in the Health Office only.
- 9. Parents must pick up all unused medication within one week of the end of the school year, otherwise the school nurse is legally obligated to destroy it.
- **10.** By law, parents MUST pick up all controlled substances at the end of the academic year.

<u>Field Trips</u>

Student must have an updated Health Emergency Form on file in health office. Those who self- carry inhalers, epi pens, or diabetes supplies are expected to bring their medications from home for field trips. If this form is not on file, or medications are not available, your child will be excluded from field trips for their own safety

Sports Participation

Sports registration is handled electronically through Family ID. To facilitate the eligibility validation process parents should complete the registration form a minimum of **two weeks prior to the tryout dates**.

Please be advised registration does not confirm eligibility. The following items are required:

- A physical that is less than 13 months old on file in the Health Office Physicals may be uploaded electronically through Family ID, mailed or delivered directly to the Health Office.
- No current physician-imposed restrictions from previous injuries or conditions
 A note for the primary care provider is required to provide clearance from a current injury of condition to resulted in
 exclusion from sports
- 3. Those with history of concussion must have on file in the Nurses Office a physician note clearing the concussion, and have completed the return to play protocol with the Athletic Trainer.

You may use Family ID at any time to check for when your physical expires. You will also get an email from Family ID 60 days in advance of the expiration date of your physical.

<u>Illness or Injury</u>

If a student becomes injured or ill in school, he/she should report to the Health Office. The nurse will evaluate the child and contact the parent if necessary. Students must not leave the building because of illness/injury without authorization from the school nurse, as this may result in an unexcused absence.

The following guidelines should be helpful to you in determining if your child should be in school:

- 1. Fever free (less than 100.0) for twenty-four hours before returning to school.
- 2. No episodes of vomiting for 24 hours.
- 3. No active communicable and/ or contagious infections
- 4. On antibiotics for 24 hours before returning from a communicable infection

Requirements for Return to School after Surgery or Serious Illness/Injury

Students returning to school after surgery or a serious illness, concussion, or hospitalization must provide a note from a physician indicating clearance to return to school.

1. The note should include any restrictions (i.e.: no physical education) or required accommodations (i.e.: elevator use). Continued restrictions must be updated by the physician.

Attention Fall Athletes

High School sports programs begin their practices before the first day of school. All updated sports physicals must be at the Health Office by Tuesday, **August 6, 2019**. We require the State blue form to participate in our sports program. The form can be down loaded from our web site or be obtained from the Athletic or Health Offices. The form will be reviewed for completeness (dates, signatures, restrictions, etc.) before it can be entered on the athletic eligibility list. Coaches will receive the eligibility list on Thursday at the athlete/coach meeting in preparation for the Thursday initial practice. **DO NOT WAIT UNTIL TUESDAY, AUGUST 27th TO HAND IN YOUR SPORTS PHYSICAL!** If the student athlete's name is not on the eligibility list, the coach cannot allow them to participate. Hundreds of sports physicals arrive over the summer to be reviewed and processed. Late physicals may not be processed in time for the first practice. If you are unsure of physical dates or eligibility requirements, please call the Health Office at 379-8525 ext. 2618.

Football conditioning starts on **August 19, 2018**. If your sports physical expires prior to that date you will not be allowed to participate until it is updated. It must be on file in the Nurses Office by noon on **August 6, 2019** all other fall sports. The eligibility list will then be given to the coach. Coaches do not accept sports physicals. They need the permission form for you to participate. There are hundreds of forms that come in over the summer that need to be reviewed and processed. When you drop off your physical form please mark in **BOLD** that it is for football so that it can be processed in a timely manner. If you turn in your physical form late you need to bring it to the school nurse and if the form is <u>complete</u> you will get an eligibility card.




