INDUSTRY-BASED CERTIFICATION DESCRIPTION

The Emergency Medical Technician Basic certification exam measures important competencies you will need as you work as part of a comprehensive EMS response system.

The National Registry Assessment Exam will cover the entire spectrum of EMS care including: Airway, Respiration & Ventilation; Cardiology & Resuscitation; Trauma; Medical; Obstetrics/Gynecology; EMS Operations. In order to pass the exam, candidates must meet a standard level of competency. The passing standard is defined by the ability to provide safe and effective entry level emergency medical care.

To qualify for the EMT Basic license in Texas, the following requirements must be met:

A student should be 18 years old, have a high school diploma or GED certificate, successfully complete a DSHS approved EMS training course, submit a completed EMS Personnel Certification application and fee, pass the National Registry exam and submit fingerprints for Texas/FBI criminal history check.
