Absences for Reasons Other Than Illness

school except for serious reasons (illness, family emergencies, etc.). Parents who, for justifiable reasons other than illness, wish to take their children out of school for periods of one day or longer must submit a written request to the child's teacher and the School Head at least a week in advance. Upon approval, the individual teacher(s) involved will gather assignments, if appropriate, to be completed while away from school. Parents must recognize that to take a child out of school for a prolonged period may (and often does) affect that child's performance. Much of the work done at school can only be completed in the classroom and cannot be assigned to complete while away. (If the school feels that a family is abusing this policy, it may take appropriate disciplinary action.)

Accidents or Illness

In case of illness or an accident, your child will be taken to the school nurse for evaluation. You will be called following this initial evaluation. In the event you do not answer, one of your emergency numbers will be called.

In order for students to receive academic accommodations, a formal diagnosis as part of a psychological, psychoeducational, or neuropsychological evaluation completed by a licensed psychologist or neuropsychologist is required. This completed report must be submitted to the learning specialist and will be kept confidential. In order to continue receiving accommodations, students must be re-evaluated every three years. While all recommendations from outside evaluators are considered, each division's administration and learning specialist will determine which accommodations will be provided on that particular campus.

Based upon these determinations, the learning specialist will write an accommodation plan. Shady Side Academy, as an independent school, is not required to modify

All fourth and fifth grade students participate in our extensive instrumental music program.
