Be permitted to carry an EpiPen on his/her person, or backpack/ sports bag, as we consider him/her to be responsible for its use in a sudden anaphylaxis attack warranting immediate accessibility.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT A SECOND BACKUP EPIPEN IS KEPT IN HEALTH OFFICE FOR EMERGENCY USE AND TO SERVE AS A BACKUP IN CASE AN EMERGENCY SITUATION OCCURS WHERE EPIPEN CANNOT BE OBTAINED OR STUDENT FORGETS TO BRING EPIPEN IN BACKPACK OR SPORTS BAG.

1. Student has been instructed in, and understands the purpose, proper use and appropriate method to use EPIPEN.
2. Student will inform his/her teacher or coach when it is necessary to use the EPIPEN and will use it only as prescribed for an emergency anaphylaxis reaction.
3. Student will use and have access to second EPIPEN in health office during regular school hours.
4. Student will not share EpiPen with anyone .
5. Student will lose the privilege to carry EPIPEN if used inappropriately or irresponsibly.

**We, the undersigned, absolve the school of any responsibility in safe guarding our child's EPIPEN and agree to the above terms stated in this EPIPEN Self-Carry Form.**
