CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS FOR BAND

1. Students must be in their seat with all required materials by the end of the passing period.
 - Tardiness will follow the Southwestern Middle School Tardy Policies.
 - Restroom Policy will follow the Grade Level Restroom Policies.
2. Gum, candy, food, or drinks are not allowed in the classroom at any time.
3. Raise your hand and wait to be called on before speaking or leaving your seat, unless there is an emergency.
4. Keep your hands, feet, and all other objects to yourself - No Bullying
5. Do not disrupt the education of other students in any way or manner.

TECHNOLOGY EXPECTATIONS FOR BAND

1. Bring your Chromebook charged and ready to use when needed for class.
2. Your Chromebook will be used primarily for playing tests, music theory homework, and other web-based assignments.
3. When your Chromebook is not being used for class, it should be put away under your seat.

Students are expected to respect each other as individuals, demonstrate good citizenship, follow class rules and expectations, participate in class in a positive manner, and complete class work and homework to the best of their ability by the scheduled due date.

EXPECTATION CONSEQUENCES

- 1st time: Verbal Warning (you will be aware)
- 2nd time: Student conference with the teacher after class
- 3rd time: Parents contacted AND detention before, after, or during school.
- 4th or more times: Discipline Referral to Office + Parents Contacted

CONCERT DRESS CODE

It is very important all the Southwestern Band students present a good appearance at all school and public performances. A "Band Polo Shirt Order Form" is included in this handbook for your viewing. The same form will be sent home with all band students in early September.

Please take note of the other required attire in the Southwestern Band Dress Code:

The dress code for all performances is as follows:

Gentlemen:

- Southwestern Band Polo Shirt (Please wear a white shirt under your polo shirt)
- Black Dress Pants
- Black Socks
- Black Dress Shoes.

Ladies:

- Southwestern Band Polo Shirt (Please wear a black or white shirt under your polo)
- Black Dress Pants
- Black Socks
- Black Dress Shoes – Black flat OR closed-toe shoe with a maximum of a 2 inch heel

DAILY REHEARSAL PROCEDURES

1. Enter the room with a positive attitude and good behavior.
2. Find your seat quickly and read the daily agenda.
3. Attendance and announcements.
4. Get your band instrument, music folder, and return to your assigned seat.
5. Put your music and materials in order according to the daily agenda.
6. When the teacher is on the podium, no one should be talking.
7. If you are well enough to be at school, you are well enough to play your instrument. If you have an injury inhibiting you from participating in class, a note is required from your doctor or the school nurse.

Equipment Rental and Care

Equipment Care:

Your band instrument will function properly if it is cared for properly.

All students are expected to:

- Keep their instrument(s) in good working condition
- Keep their music book and black music binder in good condition
- Keep the band folder cart and school issued instrument storage lockers in good condition
- Students are responsible for all sheet music issued to them.

Band Instrument Storage and Lockers

Student Instrument Storage Area:

A place to store your instrument is provided by the school. Students are responsible for any item contained in the storage area. The band storage and locker areas are school property and subject to search at any time by school officials and/or law authorities. Please respect the storage areas and plan on taking your instrument home each day to practice and be prepared.

CLASS MATERIALS

Students are expected to bring the following materials to class each day without exceptions.

6th Grade Band – Beginning Band

- Flat Black – 1 inch Music Binder for sheet music – Needed for 2nd semesters
- Yellow Highlighter
- Beginning Band Starter Pack – Purchased from the music store

 - Essential Elements 2000 Interactive Band Method – Book I
 - Instrument maintenance supplies include items such as: pencil, reeds, valve oil, slide grease, cork grease, swabs, mouthpiece cushion, and a polishing cloth

7th Grade Band – Intermediate Band

- Musical Instrument
- Essential Elements 2000 interactive Band Method - Book II
 - Woodwind and Brass Book II: \$10.00
 - Percussion Book II: \$17.00
- Southwestern Red Warm-up Binder - Provided by the school
- Flat Black – 1 inch Music Binder for sheet music
- Pencil (PLEASE – NO PENS)
- Proper instrument maintenance supplies: Reeds, valve oil, slide grease, cork grease, swab, etc.

8th Grade Band – Advanced Band

- Musical Instrument
- Essential Elements 2000 interactive Band Method - Book II
 - Woodwind and Brass Book II: \$10.00
 - Percussion Book II: \$17.00
- Southwestern White Warm-up Binder – Provided by the school
- Flat Black – 1 inch Music Binder for sheet music
- Pencil (PLEASE – NO PENS)
- Proper instrument maintenance supplies: Reeds, valve oil, slide grease, cork grease, swab, etc.

Grading Policy

10% Daily Preparedness and Habits

- Students try their best to have a positive attitude and respectful behavior.
- Students come to class prepared with the proper materials each day.
- Students are prepared to play all required music in class each day.
- Instrument Care and Maintenance - Students should keep their band instrument in good working condition every day.

20% Homework

- Homework will cover music theory, music history, music terms and vocabulary, which will be used to prepare for assessments.

10% Written Tests & Class Writing

- Students will be tested over music theory, music history, music terms and vocabulary. In class, we will also write reflective and self-assessment journals regarding aspects of being a good musician, concert preparation, and concert etiquette.

20% Playing Tests

- Playing Tests will be used to assess student progress several times throughout each grading period. Playing tests will be worth 20 points each. Students will be tested on material covered in class by using the TSC Playing Test Rubric.

10% Final Exam/End of Course Assessment

- Students will take either a written or performance based final exam at the end of each semester.

30% Concert Attendance

- ALL practices and performances have been scheduled in advance and are a co-curricular requirement of band class. Band concerts and performances should not conflict with any Southwestern sporting activities. Please see the attached calendar of events. No points or grade can be earned if a student is not in attendance for any scheduled performance.
 - Students are expected to attend each required performance.
 - Unexcused absences will not be accepted.
 - Excused absences (illness, death in the family, etc) will only be accepted with a signed note from a parent or doctor's note on file with the school office.
 - Missing any performance will require make-up work.
 - Missing more than 2 scheduled performances in a school year will result in the removal from band.
 - Please plan ahead and be a participating and valued member of our team.

Extra Credit and Make-up Work

BOX TOPS FOR EDUCATION

The Southwestern Band Department participates in the Box Tops for Education program sponsored by General Mills Company. Clip the box top coupons from the many participating General Mills products and turn them into your teacher. Each coupon is worth \$.10 and will be used to help Southwestern band students. To get the extra credit, please bring un-expired box tops in a Ziploc type container marked with the first and last name of the student. You can also turn in the Box Tops for Education Sheets with the box tops glued on the sheet.

- 10 Points for every 100 Box Tops

HONOR BANDS

Any Intermediate Band and Advanced Band student who participates in the Indiana Bandmasters All-Region Band.

- 50 Points for 2 Rehearsals and the Concert
- You MUST attend both rehearsals and perform in the concert

NON-SOUTHWESTERN CONCERT ATTENDANCE

Students who attend approved concerts and show proof of attendance may receive extra credit. This includes concerts by other TSC performance groups, symphony concerts, collegiate music concerts, Purdue Convocations, and other approved performances.

- 20 Points per review (Program Bill or Concert Program Handout is Required)

CONCERT REVIEWS & MUSIC REPORTS

Students can receive extra credit if they write a review of a recently attended concert or performance. Music reports, on approved topics, can be turned in for extra credit. The source for the information must be cited. Plagiarism or anything remotely close will not be accepted.

- 20 Points per review (Program Bill or Concert Program Handout is Required)

MUSICAL PERFORMANCES

Director-approved repertoire may be given to the students to perform in class. The performances must show outside work and be performance ready.

- 20 Points per performance
- Must be Teacher Approved

MUSIC COMPOSITIONS

Composing your own music is highly encouraged. Any student who is interested in composing music for members of the band to perform.

- 20 Points per composition
- Must be Teacher Approved

SOLO AND ENSEMBLE CONTEST

The annual Indiana State School Music Association (ISSMA) Solo & Ensemble Contest will be held in at Harrison High School. All band students are highly encouraged to participate in the ISSMA contests. Students interested in participating in solo and ensemble will be responsible for filling out the ISSMA forms provided by the band director and preparing their pieces.

- 5 points per after school help session (3 are required)
- 50 Points for Performance of your Solo or Ensemble
