University language courses taught in the high school setting

Open to all students at designated DLI pathway sites who pass the AP or language placement exam
 Upper division (3000 level) university courses
 (bypassing general education language courses)
 New courses, designed specifically for students in grades 10-12





- Concurrent Enrollment (CE)
 - Part of the Utah System of Higher Education (USHE)
 - Transferrable credit across all 6 of Utah's public institutions (BYU is working on accepting credit as well)
 - Students officially enroll at their partner university while earning credit towards HS graduation
 - 3 university credits
 - 1 high school credit
 - Counts towards Regents' Scholarship
 - Counts towards Seal of Biliteracy



- Concurrent Enrollment (CE)
 - Students must enroll for <u>both</u> high school and university credit. They may not enroll only with the HS.

Students must send their AP score to their partnering institution (WSU, UofU, UVU, or DSU). They can do this for free when they register for the AP exam.
If score results were not already sent, visit apscore.collegeboard.org to send your scores to the university.



- Concurrent Enrollment (CE)
 Students are responsible to:
 - Enroll and register <u>on time</u> for the Bridge course as university students (see your teacher to get the Course Number).
 - Pay fee to the university to enroll (for WSU, UVU, DSU)
 - Pay \$15 CE tuition for each course
 - Maintain homework, attendance and academic integrity as university students.



Unique to Concurrent Enrollment (CE)

- 3-credit course extended over the entire school year (extended support and practice to meet 3000 level learning outcomes).
- University instructor and high school instructor co-plan, coinstruct, and assess as a team.

<u>University</u> instructor – at the HS 1 day/week

• Focuses on delivering university content, theory, and learning objectives comparable to on-campus upper division courses.

High school instructor - leads instruction other 1-2 days/week

 Serves as specialist for designing lessons to scaffold learning, provides extended practice and feedback on learning objectives.

Concurrent Enrollment Policies for the Bridge Program

- "Pure" Class (must enroll in both HS and University)
- Enrollment cap: 30
- <u>Prerequisites</u>: submit a passing grade on the AP test from grade 9, 10, or 11
- <u>University Articulation</u>: students may apply 3, 6, or 9 credits which count toward a minor/major (with a grade of C or higher)



<u>Minor / Major Pathways</u> – go to L2TReC website and view what courses you will need to take after HS to complete a degree.

The bridge program guarantees that credits earned will count toward a student's minor or major in their language of study

Essentials that all student should know about college

- Students begin their official university transcript.
 (Your transcript follows you for life)
- Students begin their cumulative GPA for college.

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Anatomy of a SYLLABUS

Know the expectations of this course. Read the syllabus. Makes note of deadlines, use a calendar.

Tests, papers, assignments, etc. Know the grading structure USE instructor contact information: successful college students contact their instructor, ask questions, communicate when there is a problem.

What implications does you University Transcript have?... How much money could I save?





TUITION !!!!!!!

Average tuition per year in U.S. = \$8,244 Average tuition per year in Utah = \$6,069 = **\$233 per credit**

How much do you pay to take a Bridge Program course in high school?



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How much money could I save?

- ✓ Bridge courses (3 credits) = \$15 tuition
- ✓ Saving each student around \$1,500 each year
- = \$1,350,000 savings to families across the state in 2018-19



Bridge Program for Advanced Language Learning

What happens if my grade does dro Fridge Program below a "C" ?

We want students to succeed. Academic Success Plan

Instructors and student will meet to:

- Discuss what the student needs to succeed in the program
- Make a timeline for support (behavioral and academic) and for work completion.



What happens if my grade does dro Fridge Program below a "C" ?

How can parents be involved?

- Ask your student to look at grades together in the HS grade book every week
- FERPA student privacy laws apply when student enroll in university course work. The student must be present with the parent to discuss academic supports or to discuss grades.
- Help your student with "self-advocacy" skills to communicate with the instructor when they feel they are struggling. This is a college-readiness behavior that you can support.



How to withdraw from a class...



Dropping: You can drop a course *without a W posted* on the transcript by posted deadline at your partner university.

Withdrawing: Withdraw from a course is allowed up until the deadline and *a W will be posted* on your record.

After the withdrawal deadline, petition with documentation of **non-academic emergency** is required for consideration.

All adds, drops, withdrawals, and petitions go through your partner university.
