A Note from Dr. McCormick

Dear Middle School Parents,

We are off to a terrific start in Middle School, orienting a number of brand-new seventh and eighth grade families earlier this week, in addition to a host of wonderful sixth grade folks. With the exception of a longer-than-usual carpool pickup on the first day, this has been the most positive start I have witnessed in my time here! We had our own Middle School Convocation program, featuring speeches by a faculty member - eighth grade teacher Mr. McHan - and our Student Council President, Luke Beck (8 gr.).

Mr. McHan's remarks are included here:

MS Convocation (first day of school)

Hello everyone. I am Mr. McHan, Coach McHan, whichever works best for you. Many of you have seen me around the last three years as either a teacher or coach. It's good to see everyone back. For those of you new students, we are so happy you're here and are looking forward to a great year.

When I think about where I fall in this place, in this community, I get a little confused. You may look at me in my tie and think, "he's a teacher". It's hard for me to say that when I look around at others with that title and the experiences I have had with them, and think that I could possibly fall into the same category as them. I like to think of my class as engaging, some of you

may think otherwise. But in observing Mr. Webb's class for ten minutes last year, I almost fell out of my seat laughing. I try daily to appear and to act professional, after all I am a professional teacher. But Dr. McCormick was literally born in a bowtie, leading a professional development session. There's actually only a little exaggeration in that. I can hear the most elegant conversation from across the hall about the intricacies of some obscure author's symbolism in a book I've never heard of, between Dr. Lien and Mrs. Wood. I suddenly realize me not make word so good. How many of you know who Michael Jordan is? Now how many of you know who Pete Myers is? Pete Myers is the guy who the Bulls signed to replace Michael Jordan when he retired for the first time after winning the title in 1993. Imagine how he must have felt. Big shoes to fill, huh? That's exactly how I feel teaching students the year after they've had Mrs. Lenfestey. I could go on and on about how amazing my colleagues are, so you can see how it might be hard for me to identify as a member of such an elite group.

So maybe I should identify with the students who are returning from last year? After all, many of you have been at Episcopal longer than I have, and I am still learning new things every single day. Am I really more of a student? Then I look in the hallways and see the amazing artwork that you guys have produced or go to a game and see what you can do on the field or court. We've had students from this Middle School dance in competitions all over the world, win championships in a ton of different sports, and take their art to competitions and win! I am consistently impressed by the students here.

Then I think about how nervous I am at the start of a new year, so I think maybe the group that I fit in with most is the new sixth graders and new students. I can't wait to see the talents and gifts that you bring to Episcopal this year, but I can imagine that many of you are nervous to be in a new place, whether it's a new building or new school entirely. I'm hopeful it's an excited sort of nervous. That's the kind that I feel at the start of a new year. Where you just can't wait to get started and see what the year will hold. I think I'm a new teacher every year, which makes me a little nervous.

All this to say that sometimes it can be really hard to know exactly who we are within a community like this. We look around and see other people doing things that maybe we can't do, haven't tried, or would never think to try. We see people who like things that we don't or have never been exposed to. Figuring out who you are can be really difficult. You know when is a great time to start? Right now! This year! Why wait?

Now you do have to remember that you go to Episcopal, which means a couple of things. You can always go to Mrs. Chaudoir for a hug. Four square games are always available, thanks to Ms. Lewis. And you will be supported in whatever you pour your heart into. This community, more than any other that I have ever been a part of, loves its own. When you belong to this Wildcat family, you've got three divisions and 15 grades worth of students and faculty cheering you on in whatever you pursue. My hope for this year is that our proudest tradition, supporting our community, thrives more than ever before. That everyone on this campus can discover a little bit more about who they are and will have an army of Wildcats to help them along. I hope you all have a great year. Welcome Back and Go, Wildcats!

Upper School A Note from Mr. Urquhart

We've had a great start to the year! Students bring life to the school, and I've enjoyed having them back on campus this week and getting to hear about some of the great things they did this summer: our ninth graders made a trip to Colorado, and other students have talked about internship experiences, athletic camps, books they read, time they spent with family, and the days when they slept late and watched movies on Netflix. During Wednesday's bell ringing ceremony to open school, Father Rob offered us a wonderful version of the bell legend that was both whimsical and historical. One of our long-time faculty members--who has been present for every version of this story--told me how much he enjoyed this year's version, which students enjoyed and which offered not only entertainment but also the opportunity to think deeply about what the new year offers.

Most of all, I've enjoyed seeing the ways that our students engage with each other--one of our new faculty members told me this morning how encouraged she was when she saw how inclusive our community is. Several times this week, she noticed our returning students inviting new students to join them in conversation. It might be easy sometimes for us to take for granted the ways that our students invest their time and attention in their relationships with each other, but I feel very fortunate to be in a school community where relationships are so highly valued.

We know that our advisors worked closely with students last spring to select courses for this year, but if any students would like to change a course, we are asking them to see Ms. Julie Fitz in the Upper School office no later than next Friday, August 23, to complete an add/drop request form. If students find that they need additional support with any of their courses, teachers are happy to meet with them outside of class time. Additionally, our Math Lab is open before and after school, and our Writing Center is open throughout the day.

For our students planning to take the ACT in September, Ms. Tori Garrett is offering math review sessions on three Mondays leading up to the test date. On August 19, she'll review concepts and skills from Geometry; on August 26, she'll review Algebra, and on September 9, she'll cover test-taking strategies for the math portion of the test. These sessions will be held in US 102 from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. Students who plan to attend should let Ms. Garrett know in advance.

Looking forward to next week, school photos will be taken of our ninth-, tenth-, and eleventh-grade students on Wednesday, August 21; students should be in dress uniform that day for photos. I hope that you'll join us next Thursday, August 22, for the Upper School's Back to School Night. We'll meet together in the MS/US Dining Hall at 7:00 p.m., and then you'll have the chance to spend a few minutes with your child's advisor and each of your child's teachers.
