WELCOME BACK ANNOUNCEMENTS

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL – The first day of the 2019-2020 school year for ALL STUDENTS will be **Tuesday, September 3, 2019**.

SCHEDULE – School will start at 7:40 AM and will end at 2:53 PM. Morning LCTI students will attend homeroom at Parkland High School (PHS) prior to receiving a bus transfer to LCTI.

LATEX REMINDER – Several students at PHS have severe airborne Latex allergies. To protect these students, PHS is a “Latex Free” Environment. Please do not send items containing Latex (especially balloons) to the school.

LATE ACTIVITY BUS REMINDER – The school district provides one late activity bus run each school day. The activity bus will depart from the back of the D-wing at 4:30 PM Monday–Friday. Only students engaged in school sponsored and supervised activities are eligible to use the activity bus. Students staying at PHS for activities beyond 4:30 PM must arrange for transportation home.

COUNSELING CORNER

Welcome to the 2019-20 school year! The Parkland High School Counseling staff is available to assist you with any questions or concerns you may have regarding your son or daughter's academic program for the upcoming school year.

COLLEGE-BOUND SENIORS

Seniors must complete a transcript release form prior to submitting college applications to the Counseling Office.

Students and parents (if the student is under 18 years of age) must sign this form giving Parkland High School permission to release official academic records to colleges/universities. Students indicate on the form whether SAT and ACT scores are to be removed from the high school transcript prior to processing college applications. The form can be found [here](#).

If a college is requesting a counselor recommendation, the student must complete a recommendation profile form highlighting individual achievements during the past four years. Seniors need to remember to contact teachers early in the school year if they wish to request a teacher recommendation. A copy of the recommendation profile can be helpful to teachers when preparing student recommendations. This form can be found [here](#).

Ten school days are required to process college applications. Please pay close attention to application deadline dates. Submit your materials as early as possible to the Counseling Office. Seniors need to inform their counselor if they are processing an application online. Applications processed through online delivery systems (Common Application or Coalition Application) require official transcripts and secondary school information. In order to ensure timely processing of your online applications, communication with your counselor is vitally important.

SENIOR ATHLETES

Senior athletes who have not completed the NCAA Initial – Eligibility Clearinghouse form should do so as soon as possible if they are interested in participating in collegiate sports at the Division I or II levels.

NCAA procedures for the college-bound student athlete are available online at www.eligibilitycenter.org.

Transcript requests should be made through the Parchment system.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAM CHANGES

There are changes to College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) Program. Students will now need to register for AP exams using an online portal system through College Board's website. Teachers will be distributing the link and access code to all AP students starting on September 16. Students will need to know their College Board username and password. If they do not have an account, one will need to be created. Once logged in, students will use the access code to join their AP class or classes. The portal will give them access to many beneficial resources to assist them in the course. Additionally, they will have to indicate if they are taking the AP exam.

All AP students will need to indicate their exam status before November 6, 2019. For the students taking the exam, a fee must be paid before November 6, 2019. The cost of this year's exam is \$94, payable by check to Parkland High School. You cannot pay using the portal. No test will be ordered for a student indicating "yes" to the exam if the fee has not been paid. Information regarding fee waivers is available to those students and families experiencing financial hardship. A \$40 processing fee will be charged for each exam ordered from the College Board but cancelled by the student. The 2019-2020 Advanced Placement Bulletins will be available in the Counseling Office in January.

COUNSELING CORNER

SAT & PSAT TESTING

Registration procedures for the 2019-2020 SAT Reasoning Test and SAT Subject Tests are posted online at the College Board website at www.sat.org/register. The College Board requires a student photo as part of the registration process and late registration options have changed. The above changes are all part of enhanced security regulations put in place by the College Board.

Juniors and sophomores are encouraged to take the Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test (PSAT) scheduled for Saturday, October 19, 2019 at Parkland High School. The College Board allows this test to be administered only once every school year. Please mark this date on your calendar for future reference. Registration will take place in the Main Rotunda outside of the Counseling Office beginning in mid-September. There will also be PSAT registration tables set up throughout the building on the evening of September 11 at Parkland High School's Parent Open House. Students qualifying for free or reduced lunch may be eligible for a fee waiver.

ARMED SERVICES VOCATIONAL APTITUDE BATTERY (ASVAB)

The ASVAB will be offered at Parkland High School on Wednesday, September 18, 2019. The ASVAB is an excellent opportunity for juniors and seniors to complete a career aptitude test that examines different academic, mechanical and technical areas. Students interested in a military career must take this three-hour exam. The exam is free of charge and administered by military testing personnel at the high school; however, there is no obligation to meet with military recruiters if a student completes the test. Registration for the ASVAB test will take place in the Counseling Office during the first few weeks of school.

STUDENT SCHEDULE CHANGES

Student schedules are currently being completed by the counseling staff and will be made available the first day of school. If a student is considering a schedule change, request forms will be available in the Counseling Office the first day of school. Schedule change policies and procedures can be referenced in the [Parkland High School Registration Information and Course Descriptions Book](#).

DID YOU MOVE OVER THE SUMMER?

If a student has moved over the summer to a new residence within the Parkland School District, proof of residency (2 forms) must be presented to the Counseling Office as soon as possible. Please call if you have any questions.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING DATES

October 5, 2019 – SAT test date

Parkland High School is NOT a test center for this test date.

Registration deadline is September 6.

October 26, 2019 – ACT test date

Parkland High School is NOT a test center for this test date.

Registration deadline is September 20.

Fall SAT Prep

Parkland High School will be offering a Fall SAT Prep class to prepare students for the SAT Exam on **Saturday, November 2, 2019**.

This course will help students prepare for the verbal section of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and test simulation in the areas of critical reading, evidence based writing and contextual vocabulary.

This course will help students prepare for the math section of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and simulated test taking in the areas of algebra, geometry and trigonometry including problem solving; data analysis and practice in ratios, rates and proportional relationships.

Important Information about the class:

- This 10-class session course will begin on Wednesday, September 18, 2019 and continue until Wednesday, October 30, 2019.
- Classes will be held on Monday and Wednesdays. Students will have a choice of an after school session from 3:00 – 5:00pm or an evening session from 6:30-8:30pm.
- **Students must provide own transportation home from the afternoon session at 5pm and transportation to and from the 6:30pm evening session.**
- In the interest of scheduling, students must select one session and may not combine after school/evening sessions.
- The cost for the 10-class session course is \$90.00 to cover class materials; checks should be made payable to **Parkland School District**.
- Juniors will receive registration information in English class during the first week of school, beginning on September 4, 2019.
- Course registration deadline is Tuesday, September 17, 2019. Register early, as space is limited.

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

The summer of 2019 has been a beautiful one but it is quickly coming to a close. It feels as if we just finished last year's incredibly busy Visual and Performing Arts schedule. The A-wing is already hard at work as we prepare for another year of great fun and excellence.

PARKLAND THEATER – ONLINE TICKET SALES OPEN SOON

Again this year, tickets for all of the plays and musicals will be available to purchase online. This change has enabled our patrons to choose their own seats and purchase tickets without the hassle of filling out an order form and waiting for the mail.

Fall Production

This year's Fall production is *Museum* by Tina Howe. *Museum* takes place on the final day of a group show of three fictional contemporary American artists being exhibited in a major museum of modern art. Over the course of the day, some forty people walk through the show: art lovers, skeptics, foreigners, students, lost souls, fellow artists, and of course, museum guards. The play is about the movement and yearning of these people.

For the first time since the opening of the high school, this production will be produced in the school's black box theater. If you are not familiar with that space, it is used primarily for rehearsals and classes. **The performances are scheduled for October 4 and 5 at 7:30 PM and October 5 and 6 at 3 PM.** Seating will be limited to 150 patrons for each show and tickets will go on sale September 11 at www.showtix4u.com. Prices are \$11 for Adults and \$9 for Students and Senior Citizens (65+). This is a rare opportunity to experience theater up close and personal.

Children's Show

The 2019 Children's show will be the classic *Disney's Beauty and the Beast, Jr.* Based on the original Broadway production that ran for over thirteen years and was nominated for nine Tony Awards, and the Academy Award-winning motion picture, *Disney's Beauty and the Beast Jr.* is a fantastic adaptation of the story of transformation and tolerance. *Disney's Beauty and the Beast Jr.* features some of the most popular songs ever written by Alan Menken and the late Howard Ashman, along with new songs by Mr. Menken and Tim Rice. "Be Our Guest," "Gaston," "Beauty and the Beast" and "Home" are just some of the familiar songs you will hear, along with all of the spectacle and magic of a Disney musical.

The classic story tells of Belle, a young woman in a provincial town, and the Beast, who is really a young prince trapped under the spell of an enchantress. If the Beast can learn to love and be loved, the curse will end and he will be transformed to his former self. But time is running out. If the Beast does not learn his lesson soon, he and his household will be doomed for all eternity.

The show is performed November 8 and 9 at 7 PM and November 9 and 10 at 3 PM. Tickets will go on sale on September 11 at www.showtix4u.com. Tickets for these performances will go quickly, so be sure to get yours early.


PERFORMANCE ENSEMBLES

INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

As a new school year begins, the Health Room would like to remind you that if your child has any health condition updates, to please contact the Health Room Staff to inform them of this information.

MEDICATIONS All medication, prescription and nonprescription, must be brought to the school by a parent and/or guardian along with the accompanying forms from the physician at the start of each school year or as your child requires medication to be administered during school hours. Parents/Guardians will also need to make arrangements with the Health Room to pick up your child's medication at the completion of each school year. **Emergency medications** (epinephrine auto injectors and asthma inhalers) may be carried by the student during the school day if the physician indicates this on the medication form. Carrying emergency medications at the high school level is encouraged because of the many activities the students are involved in. All medications, prescription and nonprescription, will continue to require a doctor's order and the completion of the Medication Administration Consent and Licensed Prescriber form to be administered during school hours. Forms are available for download on the PHS website under the [Health Room link](#). Please see the medication policy on the website for complete information.

GUIDELINES FOR ILLNESS The Health Room Staff would like to remind you of some guidelines to stay healthy and decrease the spread of illness during this school year. If your student is experiencing any of the following symptoms in the morning prior to school, please do not send him/her to school, even if they have a test or sporting event:

- Fever of 100 degrees or more
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Severe head cold, persistent cough or severe sore throat

It is advised that a student should be fever-free for twenty-four hours before returning to school. If you have questions, please contact the Health Room at 610-351-5616.

JUNIORS

All eleventh grade students, as mandated by the State, need to have a physical examination. This is best done by your family physician but may be done by the School Physician if you choose. A sport physical for a PIAA High School sport may be used to complete this requirement.

The form for the school physical you receive in the mail is the preferable paperwork to be completed. However, copies of the physical forms used for the driver's permit are accepted for the student's school physical. Completed forms are to be returned to the Health Room only. Please notify the Health Room Staff as to how you plan on completing this requirement.

LIBRARY LINES

We are very excited here at the PHS Library because of two generous grants received from the Parkland Education Foundation. The first grant is being used to purchase required reading literature texts in online audio format. These audio books will be beneficial to students recovering from concussions, English language learners, or anyone that prefers the audio format. The second grant will fund projects in the Makerspace. In our efforts to support creativity and lifelong learning, we will offer various programs and classes throughout the year. Students who have maker skills they want to share in the Makerspace are encouraged to stop in and speak with our library staff.

As in previous years, we are open from 7 AM until 4:30 PM every school day. From time to time we need to close before or after school. If this happens we will communicate the change through the daily announcements. Our databases and library catalog can be accessed through Clever. Mrs. Dickerson and Mrs. Brader will be meeting with all incoming freshmen to provide an overview of the library. Any other students who are new to the district can stop in to speak with a librarian about our services. As always, stop in and check us out.

DRIVER'S EDUCATION

Welcome **sophomore** students! Obtaining your learner's permit and driver's license is an exciting time but one that requires safe and sound practices.

CLASSROOM THEORY COURSE

Parkland School District provides a comprehensive classroom theory course which will help your student become a good, safe and defensive driver. It consists of 4 classroom periods of instruction each 6-day cycle for one semester (either fall or spring).

BEHIND-THE-WHEEL TRAINING PROGRAM

An optional 6-hour Behind-the-Wheel (BTW) training program is available through the Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit 21 (CLIU-21). Students who successfully complete this program will be eligible to take their driver's license test at Parkland High School, eliminating the need to make an appointment at the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Students are eligible to obtain their Pennsylvania learner's permit ON or any day after their 16th birthday.
- Learner's permits are ONLY issued through the DMV. Pennsylvania driving manuals are available online in PDF format along with the permit application on the [DMV website](#). **The DMV is open Tuesday through Saturday from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM.** A **new office** is now open at 1710 Hoover Avenue, Allentown, PA 18109 in addition to the existing Airport Road facility.
- The classroom theory portion is NOT required to obtain your learner's permit but IS REQUIRED for the BTW course.
- An alternative to the classroom theory course is an online course offered through the CLIU-21. Students/Parents **must** save the original certificate of completion and submit a copy of it to the Counseling Office upon completion. (Please note that the in-school classroom theory course includes guest speakers/presenters, driving simulators and demonstrations not included in the online course).
- For complete information about the online theory course or the BTW program, visit www.cliu.org/driversed. Contact the CLIU-21 directly at 610-769-4111 x1299 or via email at driversed@cliu.org if you have any questions regarding either program.
- **All students** are required to complete a minimum of 65 hours of supervised driving during the 6-month practice period once they obtain their learner's permit. The 65 hours is to include 50 hours of daytime driving, 10 hours of nighttime driving and 5 hours of driving in inclement weather. The 6 hours of BTW instruction can be included in this total.



Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Food Services Department of Parkland School District welcomes you and your child, and look forward to serving your child this school year. Breakfast and lunch are served daily in all buildings. Menus are available each month on the food services page of our District website, your building page of our District website, or from your building office. Breakfast is \$1.50 for elementary and \$1.75 for secondary students. Lunch is \$2.70 for elementary and \$2.95 for secondary students.

The Food Services Department operates all cashier functions through a point of sale software program called eTriton. Each student has an account established in the system, using their student identification number. This number and account will remain with your child throughout their years at Parkland. When your child purchases a meal or snack from us, the amount is automatically deducted from the balance in your child's account. To deposit money into your child's account, our cafeterias accept cash or checks made payable to "PSD Food Services". Deposits should be placed in an envelope clearly labeled with your student's name and teacher's name. Envelopes may be dropped off each morning in the cafeteria.

In addition to accepting cash or checks, the food services department also offers an online payment service to our families. This service, located at www.MySchoolBucks.com, offers parents simple and secure online transactions and features the ability to: (1) monitor account balances, (2) track and review purchase history, (3) create low balance alerts, and (4) for a service fee pay with your credit, debit, or electronic checks.

At any point during the school year, parents may place a restriction on their student's account. Parents wanting to place a restriction on their student's account may do so by notifying the cafeteria in writing. Once a restriction is placed on an account, it will remain on the account until we are again notified in writing to change it.
