Students will be evaluated and promoted at the end of each semester, based on their performance, growth and development.

Shotokan Karate-Do is the main of the five major Japanese Karate styles. Characterized by its powerful, linear, evasive and controlling techniques coupled with deep strong stances which were developed to accommodate the physical statures of the practitioners. As self-defense utilizes strong punching, kicking, blocking, striking, take-downs, controlling and re-directing techniques to overcome an opponent. These techniques are developed through consistent training and study of body dynamics and pressure points. Specific breathing and timing are essential parts of this development. Repetition and mastering the basics are the keys to the success of Shotokan practitioners as it helps to create muscle memory for natural reaction and maintain an excellent level of awareness at all times.

The Karate Academy's program for children and young adults helps them develop their body dynamics, balance, coordination, and posture through consistent study of the art. They also develop important social skills through regular activities with other team members in our carefully supervised and competitive environment. Increased (maintained) self-confidence, self-esteem and focus are gradually achieved while engaging in the challenges of Karate training as our students learn self-defense. We believe in positive re-enforcement, encouraging and praising the children for academic excellence as well as for their personal development.
