Important **REGISTRATION** information, please read carefully:

1. Registration for Aspen Academy classes opens Tuesday, August 1st at 10am. Both registration and payments need to be submitted Online at store.aspenacademy.org.

2. To register for an activity which is offered from an outside vendor, please refer to the information for each individual vendor listed in **GREEN** within the class description. Note: Some outside vendors may have different registration time lines.

3. The registration process is first come, first serve. Once the class maximum has been enrolled, registrations will be wait-listed. If enrollment is below the minimum requirement, the class will be canceled at the discretion of the sponsor.

4. On non-student days, any Aspen sponsored activities will not be held. Outside vendors will determine their schedules individually; it is their responsibility to communication their schedule directly.

5. Be conscious of class times! It is the parent's responsibility to deliver their children to all classes, unless they are enrolled and prepaid in extended care. Also, any children who are not picked up at dismissal time will be signed in to our aftercare program. This will prompt a charge for the amount specified in the Family Handbook for late pick up, per minute.

6. Registration fees provide a stipend for the sponsor leading the enrichment program as well as all standard program costs. Competitive teams that advance to regional, state or national competitions may incur additional fees that are shared equally among the team member families.

7. Parent volunteers are essential to a successful enrichment program. Contact your program sponsor to inquire about volunteer opportunities.
