- ✓ **Teachers:** TALK TO THEM! They will not know what is going on unless you tell them. Teachers work here because they care about you. Sophomore Checklist:

Fall- (September-November)

- Get familiar with college planning and the admissions process
- Introduce yourself to your counselor
- Take the Practice ACT test in September
- Take the Practice SAT test (PSAT)

Winter- (December-February)

- Fill out class requests for Junior year
- Take Honors/CE/AP
- If you have failed any classes, talk to your counselor about credit recovery options
- Take the Practice ACT (January)

Spring- (March-May)

- If you are off track for graduation, consider summer school options

Summer- (June-August)

- Visit college campuses to see which one appeals to you
- Prepare for the ACT Test – you will want to take it twice your junior year
- Work, volunteer or take summer courses

Regents Scholarship

This is the scholarship offered by the State of Utah that requires you take the following courses in high school (9-12th grade)

Certificate of Completion from WSU

- The LOC can be presented to any State University or College. GE requirements are waived.
- Approximately 39 college credits from AP and CE classes.
