In addition, due to the small confines of the concession stand area, we ask that no more than two students of any age be in the work area at any given time.

Dear Parents,

As I shared with our faculty and new Middle School families, our job is to know your kids and love your kids (though not indulge them), and everything we do flows from this orientation. This week we continued getting to know and helping our students, while also building a strong school climate (which really never stops). At Monday's Morning Meeting, I highlighted the importance of self-management and social awareness to being successful and fulfilled. We defined self-management as how well we manage our emotions, thoughts, and behaviors in different situations. Social awareness means how well we

consider the perspectives of others and empathize with them. I further discussed how we will help one another in strengthening these areas by taking breaks when faculty suggest it so that we can regroup without penalty and complete the class, activity, or day in good standing. Moreover, these are skills that adults practice in their everyday lives to help us be in control and be positive and kind community members. In our classrooms, too, I have noticed teachers focusing on skill building, e.g., sixth grade teacher Mr. Tamo teaching the mind map style of note-taking, one of a few note-taking techniques that we teach students. All in all, this group of kids is a terrific bunch; they are well-mannered and, like their teachers, happy to be here!
