How do I arrive ready to learn?

8. Plan for completing what you need to complete

How do I work responsibly in A.L.L?

- Work on homework
- Seek assistance from teachers
- Check school/teacher Google Classroom for changes/updates
- Write stories, essays, papers, etc.
- Make up any missing assignments, quizzes, tests, etc.
- Study in groups with teacher permission
- Plan daily/weekly use of time
- Get organized (planner, binder, Google Drive)
- Read books
- Work on projects
- Study for quizzes/tests

How am I respectful in the A.L.L.

- Use a **level 1 (whisper)** or **level 2 (speaking/small group)** voice when collaborating
- Seek the help of the support teacher in the A.L.L by placing the “cone” on your desk to indicate that you need help.
 - While waiting for help, move on to a task that you can complete by yourself or read independently until help arrives- sitting and doing nothing is not an option.
- Help other students, in a **level 1** or **level 2** if they have questions as long as it does not disrupt the learning environment of others.
- If you are needing to work in a small group you need A.L.L. teacher permission.
