For 15 years, YES Prep has created life-changing opportunities for thousands of students in Houston's most impoverished communities and, in the process, become a vital Houston institution. We provide Houston's youth the opportunity to receive a high-quality, collegepreparatory education in a public school; the opportunity to be taught by dedicated, world-class teachers; and the opportunity to be supported and mentored through college graduation. YES Prep builds a foundation for all students to achieve by recruiting talented people; developing resources, tools, and systems for effectiveness; and encouraging programmatic innovation across every campus. Creating life-changing opportunities is one of YES Prep's five Core Values and a fitting theme for our 2012 Annual Report, which highlights a year of prestigious honors, new partnerships, and strategic growth. Each year, our results offer more evidence that Houston-based YES Prep has developed the best overall model in the country for educating economically disadvantaged students — a model with the greatest potential to extinguish the opportunity gap.

In the beginning, YES Prep was a small-scale project and one of the "best-kept secrets" in Houston. When we decided to open our second school, many teachers, students, and families questioned whether it was the right decision — they worried that growth would dilute our unique qualities and the integrity of our educational model. Nevertheless, we also shared a sense of urgency and obligation to ensure that YES Prep continued to create life-changing opportunities for more students in more communities. Today, we operate 11 schools and serve nearly 7,000 students with the same unsurpassed level of quality that has defined YES Prep from the beginning.



CHANGING THE PLAYING FIELD

YES Prep was founded on a simple premise: students from low-income communities can achieve at the same levels as their peers in more affluent communities when given access to similar opportunities and resources.



We create a culture of rigor, high expectations, and support — the same quality that you would expect from our nation's top college preparatory schools. In 1998, we received our state charter and became one of the first school systems in the country to make college acceptance a high school graduation requirement. For 15 years, YES Prep has remained focused on changing the national conversation about academic expectations and achievement in low-income communities. When we conclude our current growth phase, YES Prep will have a school in the center of every low-income community in Houston and contribute roughly 1,100 more college graduates to the city every year. YES Prep intends to continue growing: strengthening Houston and replicating our successful model in another region.



RINGING CHANGE INTO THE CLASSBOOM

YES Prep is one of the most outstanding charter school systems in the country because we recruit, train, and develop many of the best and brightest teachers in the nation. We offer professional development through Teaching Excellence, our mentoring and training program for beginning teachers, and the YES Prep Continuum, our compensation model that develops and rewards high-performing teachers. Some of our notable human capital accomplishments in 2012 are:

- YES Prep's teacher retention rate increased by 16%
- Teaching Excellence trained 168 teachers from YES Prep and partners with KIPP Houston, Uplift Education, and Chinquapin Preparatory School
- YES Prep launched an intranet website to allow teachers to track their progress throughout the school year, which is a more comprehensive approach to teacher evaluation in comparison to traditional ISDs

YES Prep prepares all students for college by providing a rigorous program that includes a longer school day and year, service-learning and enrichment opportunities, and a personalized college counseling program that supports students to and through college graduation. We serve students as individuals and take a comprehensive view of student development. Our intervention program ensures that we identify students who are struggling early and create a personalized plan that puts them on track to graduate college-ready.


YES Prep increased the number of qualifying scores on Advanced Placement (AP) exams and improved our overall passing rate.

Overall passing rate increased from 43% in 2010 to 59% in 2012.



[•] Curriculum in all grade levels is AP-aligned, which ensures that our curriculum adequately prepares students for both the AP exams and college-level coursework.

In 2012, the Texas Education Agency (TEA) replaced the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) with the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR). The graphs below illustrate our impressive results.

The College and Career Initiatives program prepares current students and alumni to navigate critical transitions during high school, college, and entry into the workforce.

• ALUMNI PROGRAMS

In 2012, YES Prep served 936 alumni. We are in the process of developing core programs to better track alumni, create more alumni engagement activities nationwide, and expand our alumni support services to accommodate a 23% annual increase in alumni as our school system grows.

• IMPACT PARTNERSHIP

YES Prep collaborates with selective colleges and universities to increase our students' access to top institutions and boost college persistence and completion. We expanded the network from 20 to 25 colleges and universities to serve our growing number of alumni. In 2012, 49 eligible seniors were selected as IMPACT Scholars and 32 matriculated to 15 different IMPACT schools.



CHANGE THROUGH SUSTAINABILITY

YES Prep strives for excellence in all areas of the organization, including years to build a proven, scalable model for educating students from low-income communities. To be truly scalable, we must show that we can accomplish far better results with the same level of funding as traditional districts — in other words, with the sustainable, renewable per-pupil revenue from the state. A to the question — "Can all public schools perform at a high level?" — is YES. rigorous analysis by the Laura & John Arnold Foundation showed that when all

sources of revenue are considered, YES Prep spends less per student than finance, to ensure we make every dollar count. YES Prep has worked for 15 the traditional public school system. YES Prep also operates in a sustainable model. Our fundraising supports growth and innovation only, not day-to-day operations. Once a YES Prep campus grows to scale, it operates fully within the per-pupil funds allocated by the state. This gives us confidence that the answer


