Uniform Reminder

Thank you for all the support with uniforms to start the year! Boys' Latin Peanut Free Policy

Boys' Latin has adopted a Peanut Free Policy for the safety of our students. Several Boys' Latin students have severe peanut allergies, and for their safety, peanuts in any form (candy, crackers, cookies, cakes, and sandwiches) are now banned from our Dining Hall, Classrooms, Corridors, and all common spaces. Those with severe peanut allergies are in danger of anaphylaxis, a life-threatening, allergic hypersensitive reaction that can lead to skin reactions, low blood pressure, changing pulse, vomiting or diarrhea, dizziness, swelling of the tongue and throat, and even death. Therefore, all members of our school community must refrain from eating peanuts or items with peanuts while in the classrooms, corridors, dining halls, and common spaces of the building. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this important matter. Collectively, as parents, classmates, and educators, we will work together to ensure the safety of our student Warriors.
