HUGO PARKING Procedures



Hugo Before/After School Parking & Pick-Up Procedures

As we prepare for the school year for our PreK-1 students we thought this would be a great opportunity to remind everyone now about the parking procedures we have established at Hugo (Grades K-1). <u>Following these procedures will help ensure the safety of our students at</u> <u>Hugo Elementary and will reduce the likelihood of an accident in the lot.</u>

Please park in a parking spot in our main parking lot (A). You can also park just past the fire hydrant parallel with the sidewalk. If there are no spots available, DO NOT park anywhere you see yellow on the curb. Our students are small and it makes it a real safety hazard if cars are parked in these areas. If the lot is full, please use the church parking lot next door (B) instead. In the winter time, a trail is plowed for your convenience.

As you can see, we have included a 'bird's eye" view of our parking spaces and where to and not to park. Using the map, please do NOT park anywhere you see a red line or a red dashed line. If you are simply dropping off your child in the AM and not going inside or walking them inside, please feel free to continue using the red dashed line space. I would appreciate it if you would forward this email to anyone else that may be picking up your child so they are aware of this important procedure.

Also, our goal this year is for the buses to leave Hugo by 3:40 pm. It is crucial that you use the <u>HugoDismissalRequest@isd624.org</u> if you are planning on picking up your child when they normally ride the bus. There is less likely to be a mistake made on our part if you make these requests in the morning. If you do so late in the afternoon or simply email or call the teacher, there's a chance that they won't get the message. Our teachers are busy instructing children and quite often they do not have time to check their emails/phone messages during the day. If you do email/call the teacher and you don't hear back from them, the child will more than likely be put on the bus and then you will have to pick them up over at Oneka.

Thank you for your compliance and help making Hugo Elementary a safe place for our children.

ATTENDANCE AND VACATION POLICIES

Regular attendance is essential for good progress in school. We monitor attendance each day to verify when and why children are absent. A student is required by law to attend school. If they miss a school day or part of the day, for legitimate reasons, a parent or guardian must notify the school. A parent or guardian must seek an excused absence, however, the school administrator has the right to accept or deny an application for an excused absence.

Examples of excused absences include:

- Sickness (a doctor's note may be required)
- Medical or mental health appointments
- Religious Holidays
- Family Emergency

Tardies:

When a child arrives to school between 9:15a - 10:00a.

1/2 Day Absence:

If a child arrives after 10am or leaves before 3:00pm this will be considered an absent of a half day

Examples of unexcused absences include:

- Missing the bus
- Need of sleep or rest
- Sporting Events
- Child is not immunized

Early Release: ***Important***

If a child leaves school after 3:00pm they will be marked as either an excused or unexcused early release.

Three (3) unexcused tardies/early releases will be considered $\frac{1}{2}$ day unexcused absence.

If we do not hear from you by 10 a.m., it is our practice to call your home or work number to determine the whereabouts of your child.

*When bringing your child in late, an adult MUST sign him/her in at the office

Vacations

Vacations must be pre-approved by the building administration. To request vacation days please send an email to [principals or dismissal request emails]. You will then receive an official vacation letter approving the dates requested.

At Oneka you may fill out this google form to request approval for your child's vacation. Click here.

**Washington County recommends to school districts to excuse up to 5 vacation days outside the established breaks in the school calendar.
