WHAT'S HAPPENING IN...

Reading: In reading, our focus will be on helping the student to make text to text, text to self and text to world connections. We will continue to work on comprehension skills such as Inference, authors purpose and vocabulary development. Also, please remember the importance of reading with your child daily. Just 20 minutes a day will make a HUGE impact on building your child's reading skills and confidence.

<u>Math:</u> We will focus on solving one and two step word problems with addition and subtraction. They will learn that numbers can be added in any order and that place value is important when adding and subtracting larger numbers. Your child will be learning to round to the nearest 10 and 100 and using compatible numbers as ways to estimate sums and differences. Example of compatible numbers: 279 + 128 is about 275 + 125. These numbers add nicely: 75 + 25 = 100 and 200 + 100 = 300. Finally, 100 + 300 = 400. So, an estimate for 279 + 128 is 400.
