A PEEK INTO MUSIC CLASS AT RIVERSIDE

Kindergarten-First Grade

Students in K-1 focus on exploring music through songs, games, and activities:

- \star Access singing voice
- ★ Beat competency
 - Movement to Classical Music
 - Folk Dancing
 - Musical Opposites

Second-Fifth Grade

In addition to songs & games, students learn musical literacy through Conversational Solfege:

FOURTH AND FIFTH GRADE CHORUS

Students in fourth and fifth grade have the opportunity to join chorus. Chorus meets before school on Tuesdays or Thursdays (depending on vocal part). They sing at Veteran's Day, Winter Concert, Riverside Fun Night (at the Sound Tigers Game), Earth Day, Spring Concert, and Flag Day. BAND AT RIVERSIDE Mr. Chew

Open to students in 4th and 5th grade
Wind - flute, clarinet, & alto saxophone
Brass - trumpet, trombone, & baritone horn
Percussion - bells & drums (not drum set)
One 30-minute lesson per week
Performances at the winter & spring concerts
Friday morning rehearsals (full band)

Benefits of Instrumental Music

 - Improve cognitive skills through listening, reading, writing, and performing music
 - Boost physical development fine motor skills & hand-eye coordination

The Riverside School String Instrument Program Mr. Hoffman - Grades 3-5

For third grade strings, my goal is to provide each student with the basic skills and solid foundation of learning to play a stringed instrument and at the same time have fun.

3 - 1

For the first six weeks, students learn all the elements of playing a stringed instrument, separately, then begin to put all the skills together. By mid- October, they children begin to play simple songs such as Hot Cross Buns and Go Tell Aunt **Rhody.** By the Winter break, most children in the third grade string program will be able to play Twinkle Twinkle Little Star. In third grade string classes, students progress through the year, learning more challenging songs and give two public concerts at the end of the year; one for the school and one for parents. The songs they perform will include Frere Jacques, Song of Brotherhood and Can Can.

For fourth and fifth grade strings, students concentrate on gaining greater fluency in both playing more complicated note rhythms and developing their note reading skills.

Fourth graders perform in two public concerts at the end of the year and fifth graders perform in both the winter and spring concerts.

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For the winter concerts the songs the children perform tend to reflect the holidays of Christmas and Chanukah as well as winter themed songs such as Up on the House Top and Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer.

In the spring the children will perform an advanced version of *Can Can* as well as **music from Star Wars**.
