Thank you for supporting our Wasatch Savings Books fundraiser and the Husky Hike. We appreciate your generosity and support of the school's and the PTA's programs.

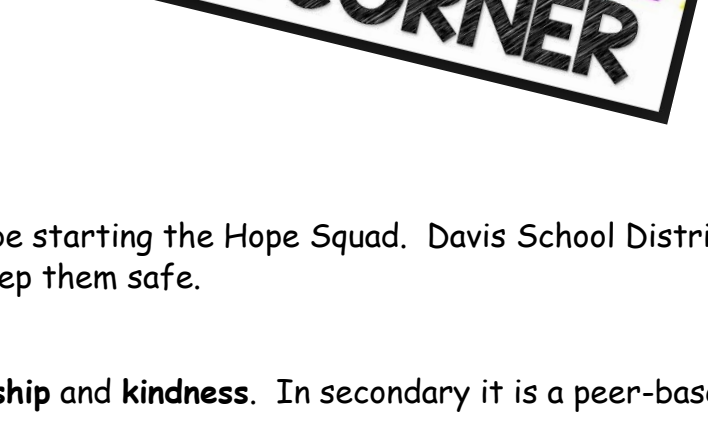

We are excited to announce that Heritage Elementary will be starting the Hope Squad. Davis School District is promoting this program to empower students and to help keep them safe.

What is the Hope Squad?

- In elementary school the focus is primarily on **friendship** and **kindness**. In secondary it is a peer-based suicide prevention program
- Hope Squad members are nominated by their peers from 4th – 6th grade
- Classmates are asked to nominate someone who is concerned about others, easy to talk with, a good listener, someone they could turn to if they needed a friend and someone who does not bully. Teacher input will also be part of the selection process
- Hope Squad members receive monthly training. Topics include hope, being a good listener, boundaries, taking care of yourself, similarities and differences, etc.

Members of the nominated Hope Squad will be encouraged to be a good friend to everyone in the school. They will look for students to sit by at lunch who are alone, ask those who need a friend to add to join in playground games and be on the look out for students who might need a friend or are struggling.

This is another way to build upon and compliment Mrs. Roger's Kindness Award program. We desire Heritage Elementary to be a school community of **friendship** and **kindness**.

Here are some important dates to remember.

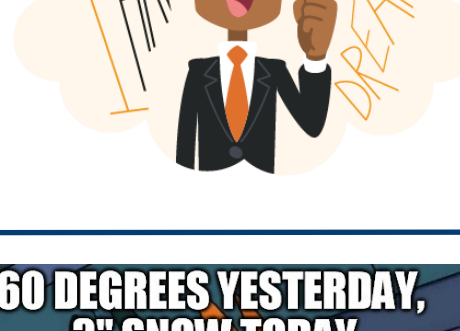
Parent Meeting: October 2, 2019 @ 3:45 in the gym.

Performances: November 22 & 23

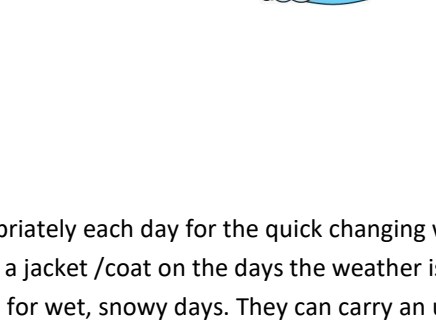

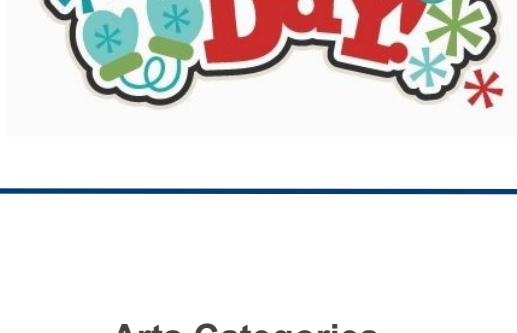

Sometimes help your children dress or prepare appropriately each day for the quick changing weather we get here. Please help their experience.
