Final Reminder Regarding the ID Cards and Lunch Accounts

Calendar Notes

The College Counseling Financial Aid Night has been moved from September 25th to Tuesday, November 5th. It will now be conducted at the NAPA General Meeting.

Friday, November 1st, All Saints Day, is now a School Holiday, and school will be closed that day.

PSAT Testing

Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will take the PSAT test on Wednesday, October 16th. This test is important for all students, but it is most critical for juniors. Juniors are participating in the National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the PSAT. Around 1.6 million juniors take the PSAT every year and approximately 16,000 earn recognition as National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists. Through this recognition, students can potentially earn valuable scholarship dollars at prestigious institutions across the United States. All of our students taking this test are urged to prepare by using their Khan Academy account to practice for the PSAT. Seniors, off from school on October 16th, should take the time to work on college applications or make college visits. Students will be dismissed on PSAT Day just after 12 noon.

Safe2SaySomething

We are happy to announce that we will be launching the Safe2SaySomething anonymous reporting system this year at Nazareth Academy High School. This program, which is mandated under PA state law/Act 44, teaches students how to recognize warning signs and signals of individuals who may be in danger, or who may be a threat to themselves or others. As you know, for teenagers, most communication takes place on social media. This program will teach them what to look out for and how to report it anonymously through the S2SS mobile app or website. The counselors will introduce this program to your children, empowering them and giving them the tools to help each other with the assistance of trained and caring adults. This program is age-appropriate and research-based.

Student have or will be receiving (in the near future) a copy of the PSAT/NMSQT student guide and the National Merit Scholarship Program information. Instant Decision and Interview Days

Jefferson University

On Monday September 16th, Jefferson University visited Nazareth Academy to conduct interviews and provide admissions decisions. Students signed up for opportunity to meet one on one with an admissions counselor to ask questions, discuss their applications, and receive information about the institution.



Saint Joseph's University

The last day to sign up for the Saint Joseph's interview day is Friday September 13th. Students who participate in the Saint Joseph's interview day will not receive an admission decision. This is an opportunity to meet one on one with an admission counselor, and ask questions. The Saint Joseph's University Interview Day will be held on Friday September 20th.

Holy Family University

Holy Family's Instant Decision Day is being held on Wednesday September 25th. Students will be able to receive an admissions decision that day. These decisions are not binding. It is completely free to apply for Holy Family's Instant Decision Day. Students must apply on the website prior to September 25th (an essay is not required). When students apply they will indicate that you have a fee waiver (Nazareth's Instant Decision Day) as your form of payment. Mrs. Glasson will send an unofficial copy of SAT scores to Holy Family. If a student prefers their ACT scores sent, they will have to indicate that to Mrs. Glasson when they sign up.

Pennsylvania State University

Nazareth Academy is hosting Penn State for a small group information and question/answer session. Our college admissions counselor will be coming to Nazareth on Tuesday, September 24th during Activity Period! There will only be room for 20 students to attend the small group session. Any interested student can sign up with either Mrs. Glasson or Ms. Mikulski. Please realize this is a first come, first serve opportunity.

The soccer and lacrosse field renovation project is close to completion and we are looking forward to hosting our first game on the new field. We will keep you posted!


