Dear 10th Grade Families,

Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year at John Burroughs School. I have heard many wonderful things about your sons and daughters from Dr. Deken and from our Admissions Office. Thank you for welcoming me to the Burroughs community as the new principal for grades 9 and 10. I'm so excited to get to know our 10th graders!

Each year of high school brings new challenges for your child. This year, as sophomores, they are digging deeper academically, experiencing physical changes, and learning to drive! I imagine that many of you are excited about these changes, but also perhaps a bit anxious. All our students will continue to experience many successes and also some failures and challenges. Together, we should help our children celebrate successes but also help them to embrace and learn from failures. At Burroughs, we want to encourage and foster a growth mindset in our students to help them become lifelong learners who are constantly improving and growing. There has been a lot of recent research on the growth mindset. Some of you may have read Carol Dweck's book, *Mindset*. If you haven't, here is a brief video that provides key takeaways from the book:

Other ways that you can help your child get off to a good start this school year: discuss strategies to organize their time and schedules; help them manage their computer and cell phone use; make sure they get a good night's sleep, eat healthy meals, and avoid drugs and alcohol. Dr. Deken, our former 9th and 10th grade principal (who is also a neuroscientist), suggested some very helpful articles which you can find on the [Class of 2022 website](#) under "Recommended Links." We'll be covering these topics with you and your child throughout the year. I have also posted the handouts from our 9th and 10th grade Parent/Guardian "College Chat" that we had on August 14 with Nanette Tarbouni and Laura Fogarty.

Please also remember that we are here to support each other as a community and we can share strategies, best practices and ways to encourage our students to grow together.

Many of you have heard that we are doing something new with our advisories this year, incorporating the "Common Day." During the Common Day schedule (most Wednesdays), students will meet together either as an entire class or in their individual advisories to devote time discussing important topics such as academic integrity, the Technology Acceptable Use Policy (found on pages 4 and 5 of the Student-Parent Handbook), and attending their Diversity Seminars. Students will have time to discuss these topics with their peers and advisor in a small group setting. The majority of the content for the 10th grade diversity seminars is delivered through guest lectures by a range of Burroughs faculty. These lectures cover topics such as the biological and social

construction of identity and the nature of bias, and then continue on to explore race, religion, political identity, etc.
