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### welcome to Music at RHS



It is my pleasure to share this year's RHS music programme which again reflects the ambition and talent of our Music Department and pupils.

For those who have experienced a chapel service at RHS or witnessed the School's marching band on Divisions, you will have some appreciation of how important music is to the pupils and to the key events in the school year. The positive benefits of music are well-documented - from improving well-being and bolstering the immune system, to developing co-ordination. For many of our pupils it is a valuable counterbalance to the pressures of work and a chance to build friendships through the collaborative nature of making music. This year the programme looks as rich as it is broad, providing

opportunities not only for members of the School but also for wider participation.

Highlights this year include the welcome return of the award-winning singer Matt Ford, to sing with the Chris Ingham Trio and the RHS Big Band. The joint concert with the British Army Band and the RHS Concert Band in February should also raise the roof! There is also a performance of Verdi's Requiem with the RHS Chapel Choir, Holbrook Choral Society and the Ipswich Choral Society.

Later in the year we present a semi-staged performance of one of the greatest English operas ever written, Dido and Aeneas; and an afternoon of fun and laughter with our annual Come and Sing event, featuring songs from a number of Disney classics.

We are also extremely proud to announce that we are the first institution to have been awarded accreditation status by the Royal College of Organists (RCO) in recognition of our organ education programme.

With more than 50 events in the School's outstanding concert venues, music at RHS relies on the assistance of a huge range of sponsors, supporters, parents and pupils. We offer our sincere thanks to each and every one, as their invaluable contributions, together with those of the performers, help to make RHS such a unique and special place. We look forwarding to welcoming you whether to perform or to simply enjoy the performances of others in the year ahead.

### music at the <u>Royal Hospital School</u>

Set in 200 acres of stunning Suffolk countryside overlooking the River Stour, the Royal Hospital School is a thriving co-educational boarding and day school for 11 to 18 year olds. The School has a long tradition of musical excellence, enhanced by a Music School opened by the School's music patron, John Rutter, in 2008.

6 This is one of the finest music facilities I have ever seen. It will make a perfect home for the flourishing musical activities.

More recently, a £1/4 million investment in new Bechstein pianos throughout the school and a stunning Fazioli Grand for the Recital Hall has demonstrated a commitment to enriching what is on offer for young musicians.

Situated beside the Music School is the magnificent 1930s chapel which is of cathedral proportions and has seating for over 1000 people. It is famed for its exceptional four-manual "romantic" organ and the smaller two-manual "classical" instrument.



#### **MUSIC MAKING**



#### THE CHAPEL CHOIR

When 750 pupils and a further 100 teachers and other members of staff sing together each morning in chapel it is often referred to as the "Holbrook Sound". The Chapel Choir has become one of the most important

and prestigious ensembles within the Music Department, performing regularly at St Paul's Cathedral, St Martin-in-the-Fields and the Royal Albert Hall. Tours abroad have included Paris, Rome, Germany and New York.

#### SCHOOL BAND

The School Band is another Music Department "flagship". Apart from the ceremonial duties unique to the Royal Hospital School, accompanying the impressive parades and sunset ceremonies, it has performed at many national events. The most recent have been the opening of the National Museum of the Royal Navy's Jutland exhibition in the presence of HRH The Princess Royal, and the rugby internationals at Twickenham. The Band has also recorded several CDs and toured abroad to the USA. South Africa and Canada

#### **HOLBROOK CHORAL** SOCIETY

The Holbrook Choral Society has been based at the Royal Hospital School for nearly 30 years and it provides an important link between the School and the wider community. The Society includes local people, parents, staff and pupils and major performances have included Messiah -Handel, Requiem - Mozart, The Dream of Gerontius - Elgar, and Gloria - Vivaldi.

#### **Organ Taster Day for Pianists**

An opportunity to hear and play the King of Instruments, and to find out how it works. Bring a piano piece to play / doodle with a few notes or just come and listen.

This is for anyone, young & old, who is interested in maybe learning to play the organ and will be directed by Daniel Moult ("one of the finest organists of our time" - The Organ magazine), Head of Organ Studies, Royal Birmingham Conservatoire & International Concert Artist, and David Poulter, formerly Director of Music at the cathedrals of Liverpool, Chester & Coventry.

Participants will have the chance to play the legendary Grand Organ, a 4-manual Romantic instrument of unrivalled power, and the smaller Classical 2-manual organ – both housed in the School's huge 1930s chapel – as well as the charming 2-manual Skrabl tracker action instrument in the Music School Library.

The day will start with a recital by David Poulter (School Organist at RHS) who will explain how the organ works and what it can do! There will be three workshops:

Basics - piano to organ

Playing pieces - manuals only & easy pedals

Hymn playing

Daniel Moult will conclude the proceedings with a celebrity recital at 5pm.





Performing in its 26th annual concert, the Band will once again demonstrate professionalism, versatility and an extremely impressive level of musicianship, as it takes to the stage for a night of traditional British and American military music. As well as the usual eclectic mix of music old and new, the concert will feature the renowned Corps of Drums and a full Naval Sunset Ceremony.

#### **6TH EAST OF ENGLAND ORGAN DAY**

STYLUS FANTASTICUS

Recitals throughout the day will feature pieces in the "Fantastic Style" - the flamboyant, virtuosic & improvisatory style of playing originating from the Italian and German Baroque composers - the late 17th century's version of jazz! Today, stylus fantasticus is a licence for the performer to play wildly - you can expect to hear dazzling, dramatic & extrovert playing!



The day begins with a recital by Anna Lapwood, Director of Music at Pembroke College, Cambridge, followed by a harpsichord recital by Christine Whiffen (including music by Byrd, Frescobaldi, Froberger, Louis Couperin and Bach's Chromatic Fantasy and Fugue). Fascinating presentations on 'Inspiring organists of the future' & 'The rise of female organists' will be given by Anna Hallett (aged 15 & recently featured in Church Times) & Anna Lapwood, who is developing a great reputation for encouraging youngsters to learn the organ (Cambridge Organ Experience & Play Like a Girl).

We will be treated to performances by the winners of the 2019 London Organ Competition, and the day will conclude with a Celebrity Recital by Matthias Havinga (Professor, Amsterdam Conservatoire; organist, Oude Kerk & Koepelkerk) including music by Buxtehude, Mendelssohn, Vaughan Williams, Duruflé and Messiaen.

He is also an experienced teacher – he is a coordinator and a Professor of Composition at Junior Guildhall and Professor of Saxophone at the Royal Military School of Music. He was principal examiner (Jazz) for Guildhall Exams and is now adviser and examiner for Trinity College London. He was for many years a supervisor on the music faculty at the University of Cambridge and a visiting lecturer at Utrecht Conservatorium in the Netherlands.

#### **THURSDAY 7 MAY**

#### ORGAN MASTERCLASS

Tom Bell's playing has been described as "invigorating" (Sunday Times) and "brilliant" (American Record Guide). Tom has built a vibrant portfolio encompassing work as a performer, recording artist, teacher and animateur. He has performed and taught in Europe, in Australia and the USA, and added the Far East to this list in 2019. Tom will be returning to Germany, Denmark, and the USA over the coming two years. Tom's recordings have been broadcast and have won praise across the world.

Tom has gained a reputation as an innovator, collaborating in recent years with poets, dancers, visual artists and folk musicians. He has pioneered the combination of organ and beatbox. Tom has premiered many new works including chorale preludes for the Orgelbüchlein Project and a cantata by Divine Comedy frontman Neil Hannon, commissioned for the reopening

of the epoch-making Royal Festival Hall organ in 2014 and broadcast live on Radio 3. In May 2019, with William Whitehead, John Scott Whiteley and Laurens de Man, Tom participated in the first complete performance of the Orgelbüchlein Project at the Orgelpark in Amsterdam. The 164 pieces took four organists, and five organs, nearly ten hours to perform.

Tom is Artistic Director of the London Organ Day, practises as an independent organ adviser, and works for the Royal College of Organists as Director, RCO North. He writes occasionally and amongst others his work has appeared in BBC Music Magazine and Organists' Review. He was taught by Kevin Bowyer (Manchester, RNCM), Jacques van Oortmerssen (Amsterdam) and Ann Elise Smoot (London).



## getting to the Royal Hospital School



#### By Car

The Royal Hospital School is located on the B1080 between the villages of Stutton and Holbrook and has ample free parking.

**From the A14** take the exit signposted A137 towards Ipswich. At the roundabout you will see a sign to the Royal Hospital School which will direct you under the Orwell Bridge on the B1456 from which take a right on to the B1080 through the village of Holbrook and onwards to the School.

From the A12 take the exit for the B1070 towards East Bergholt and continue towards Manningtree where a sign to the Royal Hospital School will direct you from the roundabout on the A137 towards Ipswich. From the A137 turn right towards Stutton, passing through the village and onwards to the School.

#### By train

The nearest train stations are at Ipswich and Manningtree and taxis are readily available. Also within easy reach are the ferry port of Harwich and Stansted, Luton, Gatwick and Heathrow Airports
