Boys	Girls
Shoulders get broader	Hips get wider
Muscles grow larger	Waist gets smaller
Voice gets deeper	Hair grows under arms
Hair grows under arms and on arms, legs, chest and face	Hair grows around the vulva (pubic region) in a "V" shape
Hair grows around the penis & testicles (pubic region)	Breasts develop. One breast can be slightly larger than the other.
Penis & testicles grow larger. One testicle usually hangs lower than the other. This is normal.	The vagina makes a white, sticky substance called "vaginal discharge". This is normal. This discharge is how the vagina cleans itself.
resticles begin producing sperm cells. Nocturnal emissions ("wet dreams") possible.	Egg cells in the ovaries become mature enough to start being released monthly, usually one at a time.
Boys' breasts may feel tender and develop a small temporary lump beneath the nipple. This is normal. It will go away.	Menstruation ("having periods") begin anytime between ages of 8-16.





Female Internal Sexual and Reproductive Organs



Sexual Harassment

ANY unwelcome sexual behavior that makes someone feel uncomfortable or unsafe.

What to do if you've been harassed?

- 1. Tell the harasser to stop.
- 2. Talk to a friend.
- 3. Write down what happened.
- 4. Tell an adult
- 5. File a report with an administrator, SRO or online: https://www.nhcs.net/divisions/student-support-services/bullying-information

HOW to Report

Who can help?

Any school personnel including bus drivers or SROs or any trusted adult.

Is there a form?

Yes, go to <u>www.nhcs.net</u> and click on the DIVISIONS tab. Click STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES. On the left hand tab click BULLYING INFORMATION *or* ask a school employee to print one for you. A form is also included on the next page.

When will the investigation begin?
Investigations are initiated within 72 hours of being reported, or 3 school days.

Can I make an anonymous report?

Yes, however, provide as much information as you can about the victim, offender or witnesses.

Vocabulary

FEMALE BIOLOGICAL BODY PARTS

Anus - opening through which bowel movements leave the body

Cervix - small opening located at the base of the uterus

Clitoris - a small, sensitive pea-shaped gland located near the front of the labia

Hymen - a membrane that partially covers the vagina to protect it

Endometrium - soft spongy lining of uterus that is shed during a female's menstrual period

Fallopian Tube (2) - passageway for egg cells to get to the uterus

Labia (Vulva) - soft folds of tissue that surround the other sex organs

Ovary (2) - two oval shaped glands where the egg/ovum are stored; also produces estrogen

Urethra - tube through which urine exits the body; located in front of vagina

Uterus (womb) - place where babies grow and develop; where endometrium comes from

Vagina - flexible passageway that leads from the cervix to the outside of the body; babies usually pass through here when they are born

MALE BIOLOGICAL BODY PARTS

Anus - opening through which bowel movements leave the body

Circumcision - surgical removal of foreskin from the penis

Cowper's Gland (2) - pea shaped glands that release a chemical to clean the urethra before ejaculation

Epididymis - the place where sperm cells are matured and stored

Foreskin - fold of skin which covers the head of the penis; all males are born with foreskin

Penis - male external reproductive organ

Prostate Gland - located under bladder and adds fluid to make semen

Scrotum - pouch of skin that holds the testicles

Semen - mixture of sperm and fluid

Seminal Vesicles (2) - add fluid to mix with sperm cells to make semen

Testicles (2) - oval shaped glands that produce sperm and testosterone

Urethra - tube through which urine and semen exit the body yet never at the same time

Vas Deferens (2)- tubes that carry mature sperm cells out of the testicles

Adolescence - the period of time when a child goes through puberty

Estrogen - the female hormone

Genitals - external sex organs

Hormone - a powerful chemical that causes the body to change

Hygiene - the process of maintaining health through cleanliness

Pituitary Gland -gland in the brain that signals the start of puberty

Puberty - the time of life when a child grows to an adult

Testosterone - the male hormone

BIOLOGY

Ejaculation - when semen leaves the penis through the urethra

Erection - when the penis become enlarged and stands up

Menarche - first menstruction

Menopause - when a woman stops releasing egg cells and stop Menstruating; usually around 50 years old

Menstruation - the process of the endometrial lining leaving the body through the vagina

Nocturnal Emission (Wet Dream) - an ejaculation of semen while a male is sleeping

Ovulation - when a mature egg cell is released from the ovary into the fallopian tube

Ovum/Egg - the female sex cell

Sperm - the male sex cell

Vaginal Discharge - slippery fluid secreted from the vagina; natural way of cleaning the inside of the vagina

PREGNANCY

Conception/Fertilization - the uniting of the sperm and ovum (egg cell)

Embryo - term used to refer to the unborn child from conception through the eighth week of pregnancy

Fetus - term used to refer to the unborn child from the ninth week of pregnancy until birth

Trimester - a period of 3 months; there are three in a pregnancy

Abstinence - the choice of doing without

Consent - permission

Self-esteem - confidence in one's own self worth; self-respect

Sexual Harassment - ANY unwelcome sexual behavior that makes someone feel uncomfortable or unsafe
