

Davis School District Boundary Study Heritage Elementary



Boundary Consultant Dr. Darrell White answers questions from members of the Heritage Community Council about the proposed boundaries for Elementary No. 63. The boundary study group met with community council members at Ellison Park, Heritage and Sand Springs elementary schools.

The boundary study group has met, tentative boundaries have been drawn, school community councils have received presentations and given input — now it's your turn.

Your turn involves attending a community open house for Elementary School No. 63, which is now under construction at 2504 West Sunburst Drive, west Layton.

During that open house — which will be from 6-8 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 26, at Shoreline Junior High, 1150 S. Westside Dr., Layton — you'll be able to view maps of the proposed boundaries, meet with district representatives, have your questions answered and express your views.

The board tasked Boundary Consultant Dr. Darrell White with three goals:

- Prepare boundaries for the new elementary school in west Layton;
- Reduce enrollment at overcrowded elementary

schools in the boundary study area (Ellison Park, Heritage and Sand Springs elementaries);

- Balance enrollments of the elementary schools in the boundary study area to the extent practical.

Additionally, White considered community priorities — such as safe transportation routes, special programs, secondary school feeder patterns, proximity to schools and socioeconomics — as he looked at possible boundaries.

The Board of Education will consider finalizing the boundaries during its regular meeting at 6 p.m. on Dec. 3 in the Davis School District Auditorium, 45 E. State St., Farmington.

The new school, which will open in the fall of 2020, is part of the bond, which voters approved in November 2015.
