Steven Fleischman, M.D. – Chair



D^{R.} FLEISCHMAN has been a member of the WBOE since 2009 and was elected Chair in July 2019. Dr. Fleischman also served as Vice-Chair until June 2019 and

Chair of the Finance Committee since July 2011. Steve has been a resident of Woodbridge since 2004, has four children and is a graduate of Washington University in St. Louis, Albany Medical College and Yale University School of Medicine. He has served as President of Congregation B'nai Jacob, Chair of the Jewish Foundation of Greater New Haven. He currently serves on those boards as well as the Board of the Jewish Federation of Greater New Haven and the Executive Board of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists.
