Question:

What is the routine for the beginning of the day for Middle and Upper School students?

Answer:

Each day of the week school begins promptly at 8:10 a.m. Students in grades 9-12 arriving to school prior to 8:00 a.m. are to report directly to the Student Union. Students in grades 6-8 can arrive as early as 7:45 a.m. Upon arrival, they should report to their lockers. Sixth grade lockers are located on the 2nd floor of Rowan Hall and seventh and eighth grade lockers are in the Science building,

Question:

What sports are offered?

Answer:

Fall Sports: Upper school students have the opportunity to run varsity cross country, row crew, play on a varsity boys or girls soccer team and there is also a girls varsity tennis team. Students in grades 6-8 have the opportunity to play on a coed school soccer team.

Winter Sports: Upper School can play boys and girls varsity basketball and varsity bowling. Students in 6-8 have the opportunity to play on a middle school girls or boys basketball team.

Spring Sports: Upper School students can play varsity baseball (boys) softball (girls) or join the crew team (coed). Students in grades 6-8 have the opportunity to play on a middle school girls softball or boys baseball team.

Are tutoring services available at the school?

Answer:

Yes. Faculty members will make every effort within the context of their schedule to offer extra help and are commonly available during Community Activities period on Tuesdays and Thursdays and Meetings period on Mondays through Thursdays. Additionally, students have the option of attending the Homework Club after school where they can be helped by

members of the faculty.

Question:

How does Homework Club work? Where do they meet? What teacher is supervising?

Answer:

The purpose of the Homework Club program is to provide students with a structured and monitored study environment after school. The program runs daily from 3:30 - 4:30 p.m. and is held in the Newbold Resource Center on the third floor Rowan Hall. A different teacher will oversee it each day, and these teachers will rotate in the same pattern each week so that students know in advance when an expert in a given area of need is available. Sixth grade students are also eligible to attend the Extended Day program with Yvonne Perrottet from the end of Homework Club at 4:30 pm. up until 5:00 p.m. free of charge. If a family needs supervision beyond 5:00 p.m. they should reach out to Allison Baratta, Head of Middle School, to see if special arrangements can be made.

Question:

What is Renweb and how is used?

Answer:

RenWeb is the online portal through which students can view their class schedule for the coming year. As the year begins, students will use RenWeb to view homework assignments and grades. Through its directory section, there is also contact information for teachers and other Doane families.

Question:

Is College Counseling available?

Answer:

Yes. Students start with informal meetings in the ninth grade and continue through college and Career Prep classes for the junior and senior class. The students are guided, counseled and encouraged throughout the process with the goal of having each student take the reins and find their own path to the school that best fits them.
