Ann Sobrato High School is a comprehensive high school supporting grades nine through twelve. Sobrato is located on the southern boundary of San Jose and the northern boundary of Morgan Hill. The student population is drawn from suburban and rural areas of south San Jose, Morgan Hill, Coyote Valley and San Martin. Students can take several Career Tech Education (CTE) classes to acquire career skills and experience. In May of 2015, Sobrato received one of only ten awards in the State of California for Exemplary CTE Programs. We also offer student leadership opportunities: ASB and Agriculture Leadership courses.
