 - NON-GUSD Students will have the opportunity to take the PSAT 8/9 on 12/11/2019 at GECA from 3:15 8:00 PM.
 - Students who do not take or submit PSAT 8/9 results will not be eligible for college classes in their first year at GECA.
 - 3. Participate in an **in-person interview** on the morning of Saturday, 02/08/2020. Your child's interview time will be scheduled when his/her PSAT 8/9 results are submitted.
- Final admissions decision notifications are sent the third week of March. Incoming Freshman Orientation will take place in April.

Thank you for your interest in attending the Dr. TJ Owens Gilroy Early College Academy at Gavilan Community College. Dr. TJ Owens Gilroy Early College Academy is an educational partnership between Gilroy Unified School District and Gavilan College and is one of the Early College High Schools that was initially funded through the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

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The Academy is an innovative, academic environment designed to serve motivated students with high academic achievement potential. Early College High Schools are small schools that seek to (1) prepare at-risk high school students for successful career and educational futures through a full integration of a rigorous high school and college academic venue with the world of work; (2) improve academic performance and self-concept; and (3) increase high school and college/university completion rates.

From those students who demonstrate the required academic potential, we then look for students who meet one or more of the following criteria, based on the Early College High School mission of serving students traditionally underrepresented in a four-year university setting:

- · First in the immediate family (parents and siblings) to attend and graduate from a four-year college or university
- From a low income family (qualifies for free/reduced lunch)
- Speak a language at home that is other than English
- Faced with special circumstances that may be obstacles to future academic achievement in a traditional high school environment

Admittance to the Academy is not limited to students meeting the above-mentioned criteria. It is based on a holistic review of the student's completed/submitted application, which includes this completed student assessment and recommendation, a personal essay, a parent statement, most recent CAASPP (or standardized test) scores, previous academic achievement, and results/recommendation from an interview panel. Applicants should have an overall GPA of 2.5 – 4.0, CAASPP scores in the "Meeting or Exceeding Standards" range, a history of excellent attendance and citizenship with minimal school discipline issues, and the ability to read above the 9th grade level.

Application to the academy is open to all students, regardless of school district of residence. While the program primarily serves students who apply from Gilroy Unified School District, GECA also considers students who apply from surrounding school districts that are part of the Gavilan Community College attendance region. GECA shall not engage in unlawful discrimination against any student, employee, or applicant for either attendance or employment. All educational programs are available without regard to actual or perceived race, color, ancestry, religion, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or gender expression or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

Upon acceptance, students will be enrolled in Honors and Advanced Placement high school courses and up to 11 units a semester of transferable college courses after their fall semester their 9th grade year. All AP and transferable college courses receive accelerated grade point weighting for high school GPA computation.

We are a tightly knit school community that is, in many respects, a second family. We have our fun, too, with student government, clubs, dances, proms, field trips, and other special events. Students may participate in Gilroy High School Marching Band and Color Guard. Additionally, both music and drama instruction/participation are available through Gavilan. As you can see, except for competitive sports teams, we have many extra-curricular opportunities and events. We look forward to receiving your application packet and to meeting you soon!
