THRIVE PROGRAM

WHAT IS THRIVE?

THRIVE is a program created to specifically support students and families who have been historically underrepresented in our independent school community. Though not an exhaustive list, some of the qualifiers for THRIVE include:

- Students from Nueva partner outreach programs and community-based organizations
- Families that may need translation services
- First-generation college students
- Families receiving certain levels of tuition-based financial award
- Students who, as members of historically underrepresented groups, may need socialemotional support, advocacy, or scaffolding while transitioning into the Nueva community



HOW DO WE THRIVE?

The support services for THRIVE include, but are not limited to:

Advisory Agreements:

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- Academic and community enrichment programming on and off campus
- A mentorship program
- Partnerships with teachers and advisors of THRIVE students
- Interpretation and translation services

As program coordinators, we hold regular THRIVE meetings with students to build community, field school-related questions and concerns, and offer support as needed. We will also oversee the administration and facilitation of support services for THRIVE students and families. Additionally, we each serve as liaisons with Nueva's partner community-based organizations for our respective divisions.
