


## Word Study Choice Board with VocabularySpellingCity and Words Their Way

<p><b>Must Do:</b> Sight/Sound/Pattern Sort: Sort the words into categories like the ones we did in school. Read each word aloud. Think about why the words are sorted in a particular way- what does the sort reveal about spelling in general? Sort them again as fast as possible.</p>	<p> <b>Word Parts</b> Create new words by adding prefixes and/or suffixes to your words.</p> <p><b>Common Prefixes:</b> un-, non-, pre-, re-, dis-, in-, mis-, de-, over-, under-, bi-, tri-, quad-, oct-</p> <p><b>Common Suffixes:</b> -s/-es, -ing, -ed/-ied, -er/-or, -ful, -able, -y/-ly, -ation/-tion, -al/-ial, -ness, -ment, -en</p>	<p> <b>Super Sentence Writing</b> Use your words in a sentence that shows you know the meaning! Example- Beth is a <u>loyal</u> friend who helps me through hard times.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Challenge</p> <p>Use two words from your list in one sentence. OR, include words from previous lists in your sentences.</p>	<p>Use any of the following learning activities to study your words throughout the week and before your test.</p> <div style="display: flex; flex-direction: column; align-items: center; gap: 10px;">     </div>
<p><b>Then choose one of the following:</b></p>	<p> <b>Thesaurus:</b> Write synonyms and/or antonyms for each word. What about homonyms?!?</p>	<p> <b>Figurative Language</b> Create similes, metaphors, idioms, adages, analogies or any non literal phrase with your words.</p>	
<p> List words in ABC order in their sorted categories.</p>	<p> <b>Parts of Speech:</b> Classify words according to their parts of speech (nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs).</p>	<p> <b>Be an Author</b> Write a song, poem, story, or essay using your words.</p>	
<p> Divide each word into syllables.</p>	<p> <b>Word Hunt</b> Look for words in a familiar book that have the same sound or spelling pattern, or both. Try to find two or three for each category. Use Create A List on VocabularySpellingCity to record the words you find.</p>	<p><b>Cartoonist</b> Create a comic strip with your words. Use dialogue and include story elements. OR Create an infographic with your words.</p>	
<p> Practice spelling your words and correct words that you misspell.</p>			
<p>Write/type the words you misspelled or find tricky in an artistic font or in a way that reminds you of what the word means.</p>			
<p>  Play a game with your words.</p>
