Transcript (School Record) Release

The Hun School of Princeton has always honored student requests to forward transcripts. Effective November 15, 1974, Federal and State Law prohibit the release of pupil records without parent or adult student written authorization. The school cannot release records without this written permission.

Ref. New Jersey Administrative Code #6.3-6.1 *et seq.* states, "Organizations, agencies and persons from outside the school shall have access to pupil records if they have written consent of parent or adult pupil (age 18)".
