In the event of stormy weather, cancellations, delayed openings, and early dismissals will be announced on the radio and TV as early as possible. In order to help you prepare for morning childcare and/or supervision, ALL DELAYED OPENINGS WILL BE TWO (2) HOURS. When there is a 2-hour delay, there is no breakfast program and no morning preschool.

HOURS FOR KILLINGLY CHILDCARE PROGRAMS WHEN SCHOOLS ARE CLOSED

Goodyear Childcare will open at 9:00 a.m. when schools are closed.

Killingly Childcare Programs for students in grades k-8 will be combined and held only at the <u>KMS</u> location from 8:00 a.m.- 6:00 p.m.

SPECIAL EARLY DISMISSAL

In an effort to reduce the number of school cancelations, **in rare circumstances** the superintendent may elect to have a **SPECIAL EARLY DISMISSAL** and dismiss students about one hour earlier that a typical early dismissal schedule. Many storms in the past have either started or intensified around 2:30 p.m.

When there is a SPECIAL EARLY DISMISSAL there is no afternoon preschool. Goodyear childcare is open until 5:00 p.m.

The Killingly Childcare Program sites are open until 6:00 p.m., unless otherwise directed by the Superintendent.

SPECIAL EARLY DISMISSAL HOURS are: KHS-10:55 a.m. KIS-10:55 a.m. KCS-12:05 p.m. KMS-12:05 p.m.

Goodyear: Pre-K morning students will be dismissed at 10:45 a.m. Dismissal for full-day Pre-k students will be at 11:30 a.m. There will be no afternoon preschool session.

The SPECIAL EARLY DISMISSAL schedule will have an impact on lunch for students, create a condensed schedule, and may require staffs' lunch/prep times to be moved to the end of the day. School principals will set forth a schedule that is appropriate for each building.

If the DISTRICT is closed (no offices opened) ALL Killingly Childcare Program sites are CLOSED.

Parents of elementary and intermediate students should make arrangements to receive students at home if there is an early dismissal. Either arrange to be home early, or arrange for a relative or neighbor to provide supervision. Parents need to let schools know of any changes for early dismissal. Please inform your child of your plans in the case of an early dismissal.

Dear KPS Families,

Governor Lamont's office and the Northeast District Department of Health has recently shared some guidance to families regarding the impact of Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE)in Windham County. We wanted to send out information to you given the recent reports of EEE. We want to make sure that everyone is educated on the precautions that can be taken. EEE is a rare disease that is caused by a virus spread by infected mosquitoes. The Connecticut Department of Public Health is advising residents to avoid outdoor activity from dusk to dawn, when mosquitoes are most active. Mosquitoes collected from trapping stations in Windham County have tested positive for EEE, so there is the likelihood of infected mosquitoes throughout our district according to the Northeast District Department of Health (NDDH). The Governor's press release also shared recent data from the trapping stations, https://portal.ct.gov/Office-of-the-Governor/News/Press-Releases/2019/09-2019/Governor-Lamont-Advises-Connecticut-Residents-to-Take-Proper-Precautions-Against-EEE.

The NDDH has shared if you must be outdoors between dusk and dawn, when mosquitoes are most active, it is recommended to take precautions against mosquito bites. The following precautions can be taken:

1. We strongly encourage students and adults to use insect repellent, especially if they are going to be outside after dusk and before dawn. EPA-approved insect repellent with recommended active ingredients should be used such as Off Deep Woods insect repellent with DEET, picaridin, or oil of lemon eucalyptus. Permethrin can be used to treat clothing and gear, but should not be used directly on the skin. Please note that it is recommended that DEET products not be used on infants under 2 months of age and Oil of lemon should not be used on children under 3 years of age.

- 2. Encourage all members of the community to wear long sleeves and pants, particularly before dawn and after dusk.
- 3. Advise people to avoid congregating next to areas of standing water and to prevent the collection of standing water.
- 4. Ensure that there are no holes in window screens.

The NDDH shared this information not to cause panic, but to remind our community members to be mindful of the issue. As the mosquitos continue to be tracked and tested in Connecticut, there is a dramatic decrease being seen in the numbers of mosquitos testing positive for the virus as the cooler weather approached last week. Mosquitoes will continue to be active until the first heavy frost according to public health officials.

We will continue to monitor this evolving situation and will provide updates as necessary. Please be mindful of the importance to protect yourself from mosquito bites. We have attached the following link to the NDDH website for further information on this concern.

Additionally, until the end of the fall sporting season, families may provide their children with a note giving permission for students to self-administer mosquito repellants during after school and evening events.


