New from transportation - Portal to track students school bus

The District is implementing the Edulog Parent Portal, a self-service app that allows you to track your child's assigned transportation to and from their school to the bus stop. Track in real-time your child's bus's position as well as configuring notifications to alert you when your child's bus is nearing pickup or drop-off.

The Edulog Parent Portal is now available to parents and students. Parents/Guardians can use the app to get started today! Your student's id number (5 digits - they use it for lunch) along with their date of birth is needed to register. You can download the app for both iPhone and Android models.

PSAT Payment for October 2019

The PSAT will be given on October 16, 2019. The PSAT is practice for the SAT and is open to 9th, 10th and 11th-grade students. Is also qualifies 11th-grade students for National Merit Scholarships. The PSAT assesses the same knowledge and skills as the SAT, providing a check-in on college readiness before taking the SAT. Please register and submit payment on the school district website. The cost of the PSAT is \$20. This is due by OCTOBER 1st.



Williamson College of the Trades Tour Day On November 1, 2019 at 8:30AM students will be bussed to Williamson College of the Trades and given a presentation about Williamson, including requirements for admission. Students will also have the opportunity to tour the campus and view the facilities. Please note that current 12th grade students, who are potential applicants, must take a tour to be eligible for enrollment. Please register in the Counseling Office.

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and the CSS (College Scholarship Service) Profile both open on October 1st. Some schools require the CSS Profile (which can be found on the CollegeBoard website) in addition to the FAFSA. Each school has their own deadlines for required completion of these documents in order for students to be considered for federal, state and institutional aid.

The Haverford High School Counseling Department is sponsoring a FAFSA Completion Night on Tuesday, November 18, 2019 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm. This event is for senior families with students entering post-secondary institutions in Fall 2020. It will take place at Haverford High School in Room 250, and will be conducted by a representative from PHEAA (PA Higher Education Assistance Agency). Naviance:

Continue to utilize Naviance (https://connection.naviance.com/haverfordshs), a comprehensive post high school planning tool, to explore possible post high school options. Naviance helps students to identify their interests, research careers and colleges, and maintain a list of prospective colleges. Students will also use Naviance to complete assessments and perform tasks in preparation for career readiness.

How to log in to Naviance:

Email (ID): first initial, last name, homeroom (example: jdoe2021w). No spaces Password: first initial, last initial, five digit PowerSchool ID (example: jd12345). No spaces.

Create a personal email address that can be used for post high school planning. Your school district email should not be used.

9th Grade:

This month as part of Haverford's PA Career Readiness Plan, Counselors will be visiting 9th grade homerooms to introduce and provide an overview of Naviance and its capabilities in supporting student's post high school plans.

This month as part of Haverford's PA Career Readiness Plan, students will be completing the "Do What You Are" assessment in Naviance. This Personality Type assessment provides useful information about an individual's personal characteristics, careers that match those personal characteristics, personal strengths and blind spots, and more.

This month as part of Haverford's PA Career Readiness Plan, students will be completing the Career Key assessment in Naviance. This assessment is based on John Holland's theory of vocational choice. It suggests that most people are one of six personality types: realistic, investigative, artistic, social, enterprising and conventional and that people who choose to work in an environment similar to their personality type are more likely to be successful and satisfied. This assessment provides personality type and compatible work environments.

The College's Dual Enrollment Program provides eligible high school students the opportunity to earn college credits while they're still in high school at a fraction of the standard tuition rates. Interested high school students are invited to apply and participants are selected based on demonstrated

academic ability and motivation. Accepted high school students can take a maximum of 21 credits at the Dual Enrollment discounted price.

From the Nurse


All 11th-grade students are required by the State to turn in a completed medical exam form from



If you are experiencing problems with the Safe Arrival AP, please follow the steps below:

If you have been experiencing issues with the app, please follow the below steps.

The steps to perform this refresh are:

- 1. Open the SchoolMessenger app.
- 2. Go to the menu in the upper left corner.
- 3. Choose contacts.
- 4. Once in contacts, press the refresh button in the upper right-hand corner.

- 5. This screen will still show an error, but when you open the menu from the upper left the second time, you will have access to Attendance. Messages will also be populated with all recent messages you were sent.
- 6. At this point, your app should be functioning normally again.
