College JumpStart Scholarship: The College JumpStart Scholarship is an annual, merit-based competition – financial need is not considered. The main requirement is that you are committed to going to school and can express your goals for getting a higher education. The first place prize is a **\$1,000 scholarship** to help cover educational expenses. This award can be used at any college or university in the United States.

2020 Prudential Spirit of Community Awards: The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards program is the United States' largest youth recognition program based exclusively on volunteer community service. In each state, the top high school youth volunteer will be named State Honorees and will receive a **\$1,000 scholarship** and an all-expense-paid trip with a parent or guardian to Washington, D.C., in May.

Daniels Scholarship Program: The Daniels Scholarship is a comprehensive college scholarship that pays toward the costs of tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies, and miscellaneous educational expenses. To be eligible for the Daniels Scholarship Program, students must meet the following requirements at the time of application: (1) Demonstrate financial need (AGI of \$85,000 or less on the 2018 tax form), (2) Be a citizen of the United States, (3) ACT score of 18 and have a minimum GPA Average of 3.0

T.H. Bell Teaching Incentive Loan Program: The Teaching Incentive Loan (TIL) is funded by the Utah State Legislature. TIL recipients are required to pursue an educator preparation program, obtain educator licensing, and then teach in Utah public schools for a period equal to the time they received assistance. The TIL consists of a waiver covering up to the cost of tuition and fees at Utah Institutions of Higher Education offering approved teacher preparation programs. TIL is to be used for a period not exceeding 8 semesters. **DEADLINE: March. Specific date varies by institution.**
