

EDUCATION AND MODEL FLATS GO TOGETHER



At Sydenham's new super-school for girls

MANY parents thought that model flats and education did not go together before they attended the official opening ceremony of Sydenham's new comprehensive school for girls yesterday. But after being told what goes on in the model flats which form one section of this school they changed their minds.

For it was in the model flats teachers told them that their daughters learn how to become good housewives and a useful help in the home by learning to lay tables, make beds and sweep floors the proper way.

This school with a difference has 1,269 pupils, cost £1,255,000 to build, and stands in Dartmouth-road, Forest Hill. Its first pupils attended last September.

Hundreds of parents packed the school hall when Dame Jane Vaughan, principal of Summer College, Oxford, performed the official opening. Guests of honour included the Leader of the L.C.C., Mr. I. J. Hayward, the Mayor of Lewisham, Alderman A. A. Hawkins, and Mr. Harold Sherman, chairman of the L.C.C.'s education committee.



Cooking lessons in the all-facilities-available kitchen is one of the lessons the girls enjoy most. They learn not only to prepare diets but how to plan menus and budgets as well.
