



- Surveys designed for each group:
  - **\*** Student survey for gr. 1 & 2
  - **#** Student survey for gr. 5 & 6
  - **\*** Survey for all parents
  - **#** Survey for all employees

# School Climate Survey

Survey Type	<b>Total Surveys</b>	Total Responses	<b>Response Rate</b>
Parent	531 families	123	23%
Employees	129	77	60%
Students	400 ±	$400 \pm$	100%

- \* Average statewide rate of return for *parents* is 18%.
- $\star$  The 77 employees includes all classifications.
- ★ 57 out of 77 (74%) staff responses were from certified staff.
- ★ Grade 1 and 2 student survey completion was closely supervised for accuracy of responses.

# The Results: Parents



Parents think about safety ....

- BRS has a safe and nurturing environment 94%
- BRS is physically safe all or most of the time – 87%
- There are trusted adults my child can go to for help *all or most of the time*. Yes 94%
- Is there an area of the school that is not safe? Yes – 37%



Parents think about attitudes and behavior ....

- BRS students are friendly *all or most of the time:* 89%
- My child's peers treat my child fairly *all or most of the time*: 87%
- My child has been the target of hurtful behavior
  - Once or never: 45%
  - 2-5 times: 30%
  - 6 or more times: 9%
  - *Don't know:* 16%



Parents think about attitudes and behavior ...

- I feel the adults at BRS treat me fairly *all or most of the time:* 97%
- I feel comfortable sharing my thoughts and ideas at BRS *all or most of the time:* 85%



Parents think about fair treatment ...

- 36% of parents said they have seen or heard others being treated unfairly at school because of their:
  - Physical appearance: 19\*
  - Academic level or achievement: 16\*
  - Disability: 8\*
  - Economic status: 9\*
  - Gender: 6\*
  - Race: 4\*
  - Other areas combined: 5\*




Parents think about fair treatment for their own child ....

- 72% of parents say their child has *never been treated unfairly* at school.
- However, others say their own child has been treated unfairly for their:
  - Physical appearance: 7\*
  - Academic level or achievement: 14\*
  - Disability: 2\*
  - Economic status: 1\*
  - Gender: 3\*
  - Race: 2\*
  - "Other reason": 15\*
  - \* Actual number of responses

# Parent responses for deeper analysis

- $\square$  Perception: There are some unsafe areas of the school.
- Perception: Too many children have been the target of hurtful behavior more than once, in some cases many times.
- Perception: Many parents have heard or seen unfair treatment of *others* because of differences.
- Perception: Many parents have heard or seen unfair treatment of *their own child* because of differences.





# Students think about their school ...

#### They like it ...

- 99% of 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders like their school or feel it's at least "OK."
- 93% of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders like their school or feel it's at least "OK."
- 1.6%, or 24 students, said they *don't like it*.



#### Students think about being happy at their school ....

#### They are mostly happy to come

- 91% of the students say they feel *happy or "OK"* about coming to school in the morning.
- 9% are *unhappy* to come to school in the morning.



**Students think about other children in their school ...** 

#### They like them

- 66%, or 2 out of 3 first graders like the children in their school *a lot*. The rest are *"OK."*
- As they get older they say they like half of them *a lot* and the other half are "*OK*."
- 6 children said they *don't like anybody*.



Students think about caring adults in school . . .

#### They feel they have them

- 2 out of 3 students (67%) say the adults at BRS school *care about me a lot*.
- 28% say the adults at BRS *care about me "OK."*
- 18 children (5%) say the adults at BRS *don't care about me very much*.



Students think about caring adults in school ...

#### 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade only ...

- Survey item: There is at least one adult at school that I can go to for help when something is bothering me.
  - Yes: 70% 140 students
  - Not sure: 21% 42 students
  - No: 9% 18 students

Sixty 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students, 30%, said they can't think of at least one adult at school to help them if something is bothering them. Yet, 94% of parents think they can.

Students think about their personal safety ...

#### Different places in school ...

- Survey item: *I feel VERY safe* or OK in each of these places
  - Classroom: 98% gr 5-6
    - 90% gr 1-2
  - Playground: 87%
  - Hallways: 91%
  - School bus: 86%
  - Cafeteria: 87%
  - Bathrooms: Gr 5 & 6 only 12% or 23 students feel *not safe*

As supervision is perceived as less intensive, students tend to feel somewhat less safe.



Students think about other children's behavior ...

- Survey item: How often does this happen in your classroom? "A lot" or "sometimes" –
  - A child says something nice to me: 95% of the time
  - Says something mean to me: 58% of the time
  - Gr 5-6 questions only (200 responses)
    - Teases me: 37% 74 children
    - Excludes me: 42% 84 children

### Student responses for deeper analysis



- ☑ Responses: 24 students "don't like this school at all."
- ☑ Responses: 6 children say "they don't like anybody at school."
- ☑ Responses: 18 children said "adults at school don't care very much about them."
- $\square$  Responses: 1 out of 8 fifth and sixth graders don't feel safe in the bathrooms.
- ☑ Responses: 60 out of 200 fifth and sixth graders say they can't think of "at least one adult at school who they could go to if something bothered them."
- $\square$  9% are "unhappy" in the morning thinking about coming to school.

Certified staff	74	57	77%	
Teaching assistants	25	14	56%	
All other school and district support staff	30	5	17%	Full and part-time, clerical, custodial, cafeteria, etc.

Nearly 2 out of 3 respondents have worked at BRS for more than ten years.

## 129 surveys distributed 77 responses



Staff thinks about their school ...

- The culture and emotional climate of BRS is positive and supportive:
- All or most of the time: 74%
- Some of the time: 25%



Staff thinks about their school ....

- There are clear-cut policies and procedures at BRS:
- Yes: 72%
- No: 28%



Staff thinks about feeling a part of their school ...

- I feel like I am a part of the school community (shared mission, values, efforts and goals):
- All or Most of the time: 74%
- Some of the time: 26%



Staff thinks about feeling a part of their school ...

- I feel my contributions are valued and important:
- All or Most of the time: 67%
- Some of the time: 28%



Staff thinks about their administrators . .

- I feel comfortable going to at least one member of the administrative team if I have a problem:
- All or Most of the time: 94%
- *Some of the time:* 6%
- Our administrative team is committed to finding fair and balanced solutions to problems:
- All or Most of the time: 81%
- Some of the time: 18%



Staff thinks about their students .... • I feel respected by students:

- All or Most of the time: 86%
- Some of the time: 14%
- I hear students speaking inappropriately (e.g. about/to peers and or staff, using profanity, etc.):
  - None of the time: 13%
  - Some of the time: 82 %



Staff thinks about each other .... I hear colleagues speaking inappropriately (e.g. about/to peers and or students, using profanity, yelling, etc.):

- None of the time: 32%
- Some of the time: 64 %

# Staff responses for deeper analysis



The goal of the administration is to achieve 100% completely positive responses from the school district staff.

The staff is the critical component to improving school climate. What each staff member does directly effects students, parents, and one another.

# Staff responses for deeper analysis



- Perception: 25% of the respondents felt *the culture and emotional climate of BRS is positive and supportive* only *some of the time*. 75% say *all or most of the time*.
- ✓ Perception: 72% said "YES," but 28% answered "NO" to the statement, there are clear-cut policies and procedures at BRS.
- ✓ Perception: Though 74% *feel part of the school all or most of the time*, 26% feel that way only *some of the time*.
- ☑ Perception: 82% of the respondents felt students speak inappropriately some of the time, and 64% feel colleagues speak inappropriately some of the time.



In general terms, the surveys say:

- ★ Beecher Road School has a *positive school climate* from the point of view of most parents, students and staff.
- ★ The staff and parents feel very comfortable about talking to the school administrators about things that are bothering them.
- ★ Children are happy and like coming to school where they feel safe and cared for.
- ★ Children like each other.

A few surprises came out of the surveys:

- ★ Many children have not identified trusted adults at school who they can go to if something is bothering them.
- ★ Some parents have seen, heard or felt unfair treatment because of differences.
- ★ 25% of the staff say they feel *part of the school* only some of the time, not all or most of the time.

#### Feedback is the foundation of improvement



- ★ Deeper analysis into survey responses.
- ★ Targeted action plan to address identified issues.
- Monitor, maintain and promote the numerous positive aspects of our school climate.
- ★ Make future evaluations more focused.
- ★ Re-evaluate constituents.
- ★ Keep improving.
